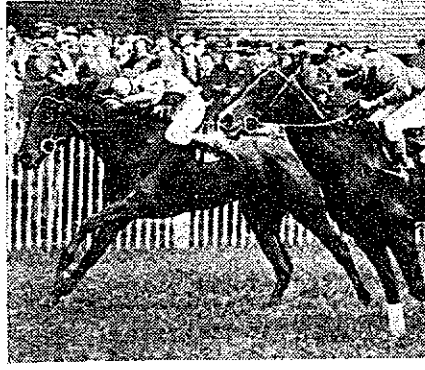

Record Walk By Galloway

GEORGE GALLOWAY (Surrey W.C.), the twenty-six-year-old Scottish ex-champion, claimed three of the four world's and British walking records which were set up in a special three-hour race at the White City on Saturday.

He beat the twenty miles and twenty-one miles track records and the three-hour record by a margin of 211 yds. to eclipse the figures of the previous record holder, G. Galloway, who had set up the records in 1913.

He walked the twenty miles record in 1 hour 11 minutes 26 seconds, the previous best time for twenty miles being set up by Galloway in 1913, 1 hour 12 minutes 26 seconds.

Galloway finished quite fresh at the end of the race. He comes from a family of walkers. His father was a noted athlete and his mother also has the reputation of being a Scottish fitter and is the present holder of the Scottish three-mile walking championship.
