420 TO ONE TOTE CHANCE COMES UP

Bonnie Dundee Wins For The King

WHEN a 420-1 winner in the tote was followed in the second race by the King seeing, for the first time this season, his colours carried successfully by Bonnie Dundee I realised that the stage had been set for one of the most dramatic opening scenes that a new course had ever had. It was actually the King's second win, but he had not been present when Firestone won a minor race at Brighton, and he shared in the general enthusiasm to-day because his Sandringham-bred colt, Bonnie Dundee, who had opened favourite, was one of the best backed in the Bottisham Stakes at 5-2.

He Came Right Away

THERE was no anxiety, and I should say that Fox made all the running, though Commander III, on the far side, was bang there in front of Dignitary.

He was obviously content with his pitch near the centre of the course, and he came right away by four lengths.

Fox had got off a pound in order to ride Bonnie Dundee at 7st. 5lbs., so his success was the more appreciated in the right quarters.

Many had obviously wanted to look at the new course in sunshine, and there was a wonderful crowd in the silver ring. It fairly dwarfed a bigger attendance than usual in Tait's at a July meeting.

The cooler and sandier side of the course was much appreciated by those who went to sweeter in front of the old stands. And a cooling breeze helped backers to make most of the returns which were so typical of Newmarket. Both the juvenile entries provided big surprises, and Mack Thane was the only actual favourite.

It was noticeable that on the straight courses there was an inclination to favour the standard, so high numbers may be preferred until we can see exactly what happens.

It used to be the other way about last year.

It is rather a curious way behind the stands from Tait's to the paddock, and trainers and others whose business keeps them in the paddock until late with that sort of passage would be made in front of the members' enclosure. Such a scheme seems possible to me.

I should say that the tote yield over the Bruntsfield Colliery is a record in the history of England, and he also returned 40-1 for a place. The French sire is now at Theford.

The Jones Double

BOBBY JONES had won the last race on the old July course on Doch-an-Doris, and he now took the first on the new one.

Mr. E. C. Jones is the owner, but they are not related. Anyway, the surprised trainer, Geoffrey Basing, knew what happened to Jones when Lord Willoughby de Broke paid 450 guineas for the unbeaten youngster. I believe the stable did not know about it.

He was unmentioned among the 20-1 others in the books, and fairly ran Bustle out of a length and a half.

Perryman thought he was a bit handicapped by having to race his own son. Mrs. Dawson Waugh must have taken it as a happy omen for her Mark Time later that she had a trifling tick on the first winner. Odds had to be laid on her name and speedily fell in the absence of Apollo and Bellacosa from the Foxton Stakes.

Radamades may have headed her once, but she drew away and beat Sweet Polly by three lengths. There is a nice script to be won with Sweet Polly.

Favourites Beaten

THE good two-year-olds do not seem to be settling themselves out, and all the favourites for the July Stakes were felled by Jack Jervis' new recruit, Bayona, who was an unbacked 3-1 chance, as the trainer thought that the Fairway colt wanted a race. He was always there and beat Malplaquet on merit by a length.

Reproof was another away and all seemed to have had enough of it. Fair Race only showed up in the earlier stages.

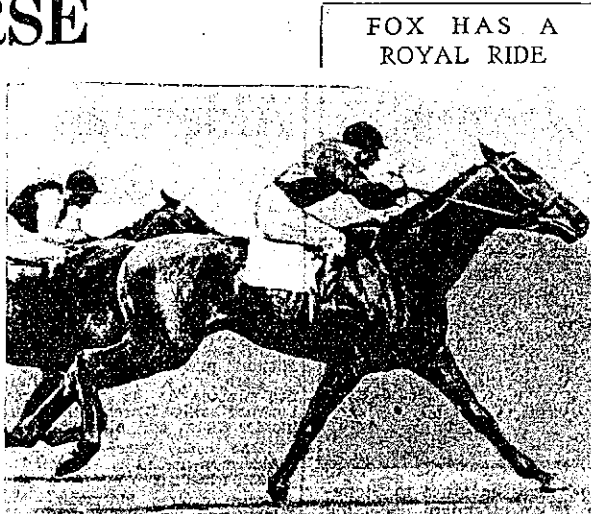
Bayona was brought up by a foster-mother, as the data could have been apt to have rather summary methods with her upbringing.

Backers of Malplaquet probably wished that there had been no exception in the days of his case.

Joe Childs—who did not also ride Fresh Fox—had his first mount since the middle of April on Autumn in the Hare Park Handicap, and he looked a likely winner when he settled the pace-making British Bird, but despite a strong effort, Malplaquet, with a pull of 22lbs. came off the outside to beat him by a length and a half.

Lord Hirst's gelding was the outsider of the seven at 8-1. The less willing tober Chief was the first of the front rank in trouble.

The Zen Khan was not a nose to the horses, today, and I had expected more of Alshah and also Hird's Eye.

BOB JONES won the last race on the old July course with Doch an Doris. He won the first on the new course with La Collina 3, 1 heard of one lucky girl who backed the winner because she liked his colours. Her two bob even way on the tote produced 2-46.

Uncle Regular ran in this race. He finished just 2-1/2. He has done well, though, since Lincoln, and might yet win a small race.

Wychwood Abbot will find conditions much more congenial than when running in the Hunt Cup. He does not have much in hand of Almond Hill on the book. She seemed unlucky when fourth to Priok. Breduddin has waited for this. He will give a fairly confident vote to Wychwood Abbot (3-9). He will be ideally suited by the course and rising finish. Dick Perryman who knows him so well will now be able to take the mount.

With Hossom (2-0) may be good for Lone Isle and others. Jocasta f (2-30) has been well galloped with Sub Rosa, 1 hear, and is strongly advised to go for her to beat Mister Man, Can Can and Co.

One of the best of the day should be Solar Bear (map) (4-30). This horse always well, is improving and has not much to
