The French colt Easton, which finished second in the Two Thousand Guineas cannot yet be considered a certain runner for the Derby. When his trainer, Percy Carter, was interrogated on the matter yesterday, he said that he was unable to say definitely, as the colt's owner is in America and he must communicate with him for instructions.

Medieval Knight, Not in First Six

HYPERION TO-DAY

 NOTHING in the nature of a Turf miracle happened to the first of the classics yesterday. Colombo won, as everybody expected he would, but it was hardly in the old Colombo style, and he will not be a hotter favourite than before for the Derby as the result. Indeed, it will not surprise me if he is easier to back now than he was before he went out for yesterday's race.

Colombo's behaviour in the paddock did not inspire confidence. He was quiet enough but obviously ill at ease by the mobbing he received, and sweat rolled off him while he was being saddled. There was an incident, however, that showed the absurdity of the rumours that he had turned savage. When the lad brought a sponge he opened his mouth and showed the gentleness of a retriever while being refreshed.

At the Gate

As he left the paddock he was still sweating slightly, but there was no fault to find with him then when he got into action. At the post he was one of the few to cause a slight delay, and when the field went off in two groups he was certainly not out of the gate in the same style as he had been at the Craven meeting. Valerius and Flamenco led him on the far side, and of those near the stand Bright Bird and Haytime both appeared in front of him for the first two furlongs.

Long before they had gone half way, however, the favourite had taken the place he was expected to hold much earlier, and at five furlongs, with Medieval Knight beaten, it looked like being Colombo first and the rest nowhere. Then came a shock. Instead of going right away Johnstone became so uneasy that he began to feel for his whip. Badruddin was obviously worrying him, and on his left the French colt, Easton, was putting in some great work.

Easton's Effort

Going into the Dip there was not a length between the leader and Easton, who continued to be such a menace that Johnstone found it necessary to show Colombo the whip. That was sufficient to persuade him to pull out enough to beat the French colt by a length and all was well, even if he had left us a bit breathless with apprehension.

But if Colombo only got there after a somewhat desperate effort, what can be said of Medieval Knight, who was never in the picture and finished eighth? Obviously it will have to be Lo Zingaro if Beckhampton is to upset Colombo at Epsom, but I think that if yesterday's winner does prove another Orwell, the Derby winner will probably be Umidwar.

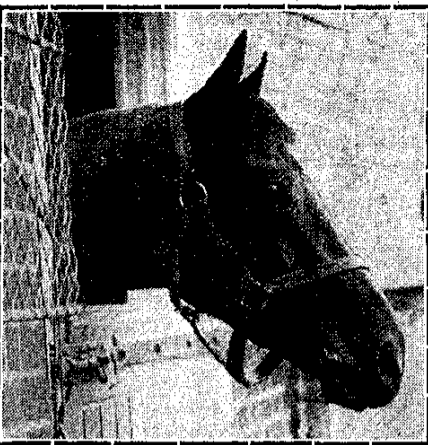
The Aga Khan's colt has grown into a fine-looking individual since his two-year-old days. There is no fuss and bother in his make-up, and still a good bit below his best in condition, he was good enough to hold a good place all the way yesterday, and finish close up fifth. In every way it was a most satisfactory performance, and I feel sure that Umidwar is going to make it warm for Colombo when they get to Epsom.

Thrilling Match

A thrilling finish which caused almost as much excitement as Colombo's victory preceded the big race. There were only two runners, and odds were laid on Loosestrife to beat

a none too reliable Typhonic. Both jockeys did the right thing. Richards went off in front to make Loosestrife's stamina tell, and Wragg waited behind for a burst at the finish. For a mile and three furlongs, Typhonic trailed her pacemaker, and then, switching to the outside, Wragg "set her alight" up the hill, and precisely in the last stride floored the odds by a short head.

Following the success of Colombo, it was expected that Lord Glanely would complete a double by the aid of Golden Araby filly in the Wilbraham Stakes. She fell back beaten after running prominently until going into the Dip, and Caretta then drew away to win by two lengths. Lord Glanely's colours, however, were once again in the limelight when Paddington made a dead-heat of it with Double Di in the Breyly Handicap. Flying Spear's chance went at the start.

Few selling races at Newmarket are won in such decisive style as that in which Rodomonte filly took the Barrow Stakes. She was first out of the gate, and they had not gone half-way before it was obvious that the youngster was out of her class in an every-day selling plate field. Briscoe provided the second and third in Carry Over and Maid of the Heath filly, and a nice surplus came to the owner of the runner-up when the winner was bought in for 600 guineas.

To-day's Prospects

Hyperion will be the attraction as an individual to-day, and as Felicitation is also a probable runner it looks like being the St. Leger over again between the pair. Hyperion will be giving 5lb. on this occasion, but the difference should not enable Felicitation to turn the tables, especially as the conditions will be exactly to the liking of the little Derby winner.

Several of the other races also have the appearance of being two-horse affairs, particularly the Ely Plate, in which Silver Belle and Vitality stand out from the others. Probably Silver Belle will win this time to complete a double for Richards, who should also take the Newmarket Two-Year-Old Stakes on Avertin. Vermel II is the danger in the latter race, but the Beckhampton filly gets 13lb. She put up a good fight against the very smart Tivoli girl colt at the last meeting.

Lambourn—Coaster is expected to figure prominently in the Long Course Selling Plate.

SOLIATIUM AND CHESTER CUP

Mr. H. L. Cottrill, the trainer of Soliatium, states that it is doubtful whether the four-year-old will run in the Chester Cup. Soliatium is suffering from a bruised foot. If, however, the trouble yields to treatment in the next few days and the horse can be galloped, it may be decided to run him. At the moment he must be regarded as a doubtful starter. Gusto II, Guiscard, and Highlander were struck out of the Chester Cup yesterday.

JOCKEY'S SERIOUS FALL

W. Lewis, the jockey, is seriously ill in the Royal Sussex Hospital at Chichester, following the fall of his mount, Rydon Queen, in the Boxgrove Hurdle Handicap at Fontwell Park yesterday. He was very heavily thrown, and it was ascertained that he had a fractured rib and a punctured lung.
