Windsor Lad was as well backed as anything at yesterday's call-over, and offers of 100 to 8 are not likely to be repeated if he wins in smart style to-morrow. Meanwhile, Colombo remains on the 13 to 8 mark with little prospect of longer odds being available, while doubts still surround Umidwar, and the Beck-ampton problem remains unsettled. Umidwar was at exercise again yesterday with Witch Doctor II, and Blazonry was sent six furlongs with St. Oswald, who recently joined D. Waugh's stable.


Canon Law's Task
