LINE TO FORM AT NEWMARKET

Canon Law Returns to Action To-day HYPERION AGAIN

THE search for "something to beat Colombo" will be continued at Newmarket this week, when the work on the heath in the mornings will be watched with as much interest as the racing on the course later on. We shall all want to see how the Derby favourite shapes in his work, and any news of the likelihood of a fast gallop for Umidwar will mean a general "early call."

But the racecourse, after all, is the place that really counts. There we are to see Windsor Lad attempt to add the Newmarket Stakes to his Chester victory, which he must do in convincing style to keep himself in the Derby limelight. Flamenco will be in the field to give a link to the Chester and the Guineas form, and, thin though it may be, it is the only Derby "line" to be grasped during the three days.

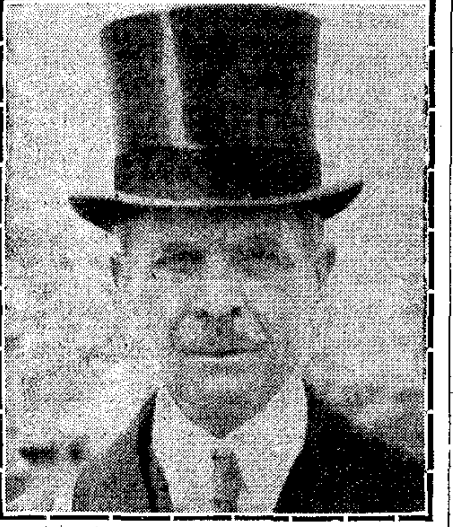
Stamina Counts
 Windsor Lad's Chester performance did not give unqualified satisfaction, but even Colombo finds it impossible to please everybody. The chief point about his victory is that it proved he will stay the mile and a half at Epsom. With most of the others their stamina has to be taken on trust. Spion Kop, Sansovino, Papyrus, April the Fifth and, of course, Hyperion are a few Derby winners of recent years I recall winning over a mile and a half before going to Epsom.

Windsor Lad was as well backed as anything at yesterday's call-over, and offers of 100 to 8 are not likely to be repeated if he wins in smart style to-morrow. Meanwhile, Colombo remains on the 13 to 8 mark with little prospect of longer odds being available, while doubts still surround Umidwar, and the Beckampton problem remains unsettled. Umidwar was at exercise again yesterday with Witch Doctor II, and B'azony was sent six furlongs with St. Oswald, who recently joined D. Waugh's stable.

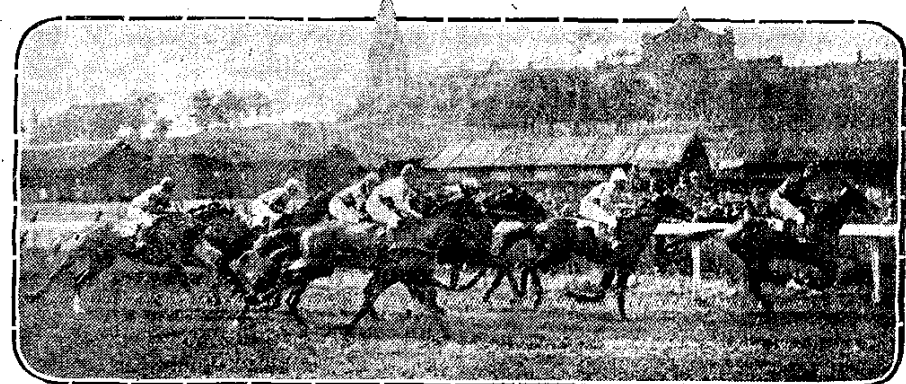
Canon Law's Task
 Hyperion and Canon Law, who might have been great rivals for last year's classics had fate been kind to Lord Astor's horse, will both be seen out to-day. Canon Law runs in the Newmarket Handicap, and although he has the steeper of 9st. 10lb. to carry, remember that class does tell. Maybe he will find Effaceable too good at a difference of nearly 2st., but I am quite prepared to see him make a great race of it with Richards's mount.

Old rivals in King Salmon and Young Lover will oppose Hyperion in the Burwell Stakes. Both are expected to "give him a race," and as the semi-dark Tai-Yang and Harinero will also be in the field the Derby winner will not have to take any liberties. Obviously he should win again, but if Young Lover finds the going to his liking I am quite prepared to see it being a near thing.

Mythical Monk and Dispensation carry the Young Lover colours in the two-year-old races. The former will probably win again, but I am doubtful about Dispensation being good enough for the Somerville Stakes with Orders Gray in the field. The Stockbridge colt gave Gynerium a good race at the last meeting, and time will

probably prove that he was up against a very smart youngster on that occasion.

Monday racing at Alexandra Park still seems strange, and it was stranger than ever yesterday with Donoghue and Gordon Richards both missing. The champion decided on a rest when a bruise appeared after his fall at Kempton on Saturday, but he will be "up" again at Newmarket after the youngsters have had their turn in the Apprentices' Plate.

Knighth, who made his first appearance on the course in a selling race, returned for the May Plate with three successive victories to his credit. He carried on the good work by trouncing Lodge Park and thirteen others in such good style that his owner must think himself lucky that 510 guineas sufficed to keep him in the stable after his first victory.

Very Long Odds

Forty Winks was also a short-priced winner in the other two-year-old race, but the problems set by the older horses were not so easily solved. Scarcely a bookmaker wrote the name of Man in the Moon in the Park Handicap, and it was a thin queue at the paying-out windows to receive the big tote dividend of £12 8s. 6d. for 2s., which meant odds of slightly over 123 to 1.

Seascape Boy, who won a selling race on the course last October, again showed his liking for the course when bringing off a surprise in the Three-Year-Old Handicap. The favourite, Indestructible, was second to Song of Erin when the horses disappeared from view, but when they came into sight again Mr. F. T. Halse's horse was tailed off. Half Mast was running on at the finish and only just missed third place.

Colombo Johnstone won the Tottenham Welter Plate on Son of Mint. Bob and Cat o' Nine Tails were both better backed, and there was a strong run on Gwill's horse prior to the start. After going half a mile Prince Manna held a clear advantage, but in the last quarter of a mile Son of Mint had his measure and raced away to register a three lengths' victory. No fewer than 104 tickets selected Son of Mint with Knighth in the tote double, and the dividend was £9 8s.
