CAMPANULA —OR ZELINA?

Fillies Set a Big Puzzle in To-Day's Classic MATE'S DEFEAT

IT was still "all Colombo" at Epsom yesterday during the intervals of the quiet racing invariably associated with Coronation Cup day. Bad luck for a hot Derby favourite is, of course, something to talk about, but it is well to keep a sense of proportion. Luck has always played a big part in the Derby, and the fact that Colombo got the worst of it does not prove that he must have beaten Windsor Lad had it been otherwise.

Oaks fillies may be slender reeds to clutch for anything like a reliable "line," but there are two in to-day's race which may help in the Windsor Lad-Colombo problem. On form shown up to a mile, to-day's race is a good thing for Campanula, who was not far behind Colombo. On the Chester Vase running, Zelina is as good if not better than Windsor Lad.

Chester "Line"
 After her easy victory on her first appearance, Zelina ran Windsor Lad to half a length at Chester, and as she was conceding instead of receiving that 3lb., as she would at weight-for-sex, the inference is that she would have won without her Newbury penalty. Many, indeed, thought her a bit unlucky not to have done so as it was, so if Windsor Lad is to be "confirmed" as a worthy Derby winner she should win the Oaks to-day.

But fillies can make "form" look strange on Oaks day and, although one must fear Zelina, I prefer the more substantial record of Campanula. Newmarket opinion is sharply divided as to whether Sir George Bullough's filly will confirm the One Thousand Guineas form with Light Brocade, but I thought she won with a bit in hand on that occasion, and the latter will have to be the better stayer to turn the tables. Thanks to Windsor Lad, Campanula will be at a better price than would otherwise have been the case. I see no reason why she should not stay every bit as well as Zelina.

The Oaks has always been a lucky race for Lord Astor, but the opinion at Newmarket is that Mis Tor will be the one to do the trick if another "Ladies' Classic" is to go to the famous Wiltshire stable. She does not look good enough, however, and neither does Kyloe, who had "nothing to beat," as they say when she won the Irish Guineas.

Speed Does It
 Hard ground kept Hyperion away from the Coronation Cup yesterday, and, as Raymond was absent for a similar reason, the trophy looked "booked" for America a second time, only King Salmon and Chatelaine opposing Mate. Mr. Bostwick's horse, however, found none of the luck that came the way of Reign Count. With nothing to "take them along," Fox was forced to make his own pace, and a job after his own heart enabled Harry Wragg to upset the American with King Salmon, who found a fine turn of speed at the finish.

King Salmon's victory went to prove what a good thing the race would have been for Hyperion. O. Bell's was second to Lord Derby's colt in the Derby, fourth to him in the St. Leger and again second when they met at Newmarket in May. The race was run in fast time, two minutes thirty-four and one-fifth seconds, which was one-fifth of a second slower than Windsor Lad took to win the Derby.

Two selling races made it a hectic start with thirty-seven runners between them, but only

sixteen horses were saddled for the remaining four events. Richards won two of them on Unlikely and Montrose; Donoghue another on The Jesuit, and as they had been concerned in a desperate finish for the Riddlesdown Plate not much of the limelight was left to others.

A quick beginning proved more than half the battle for Unlikely in the Royal Stakes, for Polar Bear must have made it a very near thing if Carlslake had been able to obtain a clear run. As it was, he was shut off behind the winner and Zanoff at a vital point, and then balked of an opening when attempting to come through. It was an unlucky defeat, but there is nearly always at least one unfortunate in these Epsom sprints.

The Jesuit Makes Good
 Donoghue secured his first win on Silkstar in the Riddlesdown Plate after a thrilling set to with Richards on Lone Isle, but his second was a much more clear-cut affair. The Newmarket form with Dispensation made The Jesuit appear a good thing, and such he proved by winning very easily from Biscuit. Quickly, who is not living up to her name or her early promise, finished last, but that may not have been her place on merit, as Richards was badly cannoned coming down the hill.

Like the Coronation Cup, the field for the Durdans Handicap dwindled down to three runners, and it was always a case of odds on Montrose. A much thinned attendance was further depleted when the numbers went in the frame, and those who went home missed only a one-sided win. Mannerling was in front for the greater part of the journey, but it was obviously on sufferance, and Montrose went ahead in the straight to win in a canter.

TURF BRIEFLETS

The King's horse, Whitehead, has been entered for the Holyrood Plate at Edinburgh on July 10, and his Majesty will be present to see him run. The meeting, which was originally fixed for July 28 and 30, was brought forward to July 9 and 10 to coincide with the royal visit.

King Salmon's next race will be the Hardwicke Stakes at Ascot. At the end of the season he will be sent to the stud.

Fall in Support Due to Calls on Players for County Games

 Diminished interest in club matches is attributed by the committee to the calls made on leading players to take part in county games.
 Northampton is one of the clubs which does not favour the playing of county matches on Saturdays. Last season ten of the Northampton players assisted the East Midlands to win the county championship.

BURY MAKE £2,719
