Likely Long Shot for the Hunt Cup

CLARAN TO-DAY

WE have heard a lot about the drought's "memace to Ascot," but a glance at the runners for the first day does not suggest that the racing is going to be spoilt by the hard going. Nor according to the plans already made for the following three days does it appear likely that the number-boards will present a weebegone appearance as the meeting progresses.

Hard ground or soft, France, Italy and America all want our Gold Cup. Whatever the conditions Hyperion will be there to defend it. And what could keep Brown Jack away with Mail Fist ready and willing to assist in improving a record which, as it stands, may Lever be equalled? Training difficulties may seriously affect the prospect of some horses, but it keeps few of them away.

Earlston "Easy"

Earlston, at one time co-favourite with Alluvial for the Hunt Cup, was not popular at yesterday's call-over. At any rate, nobody wanted to back him at 100 to 8, whereas Alluvial was supported to win £6,000 at 10 to 1. Rentenmark and Morfair were best backed of the others, and apart perhaps from Alluvial, Morfair is probably now the worst of all for the majority of books.

Altogether eighteen horses were mentioned, and I was rather surprised that the name of Tartan was not included. Lord Rosebery's colt is by no means badly treated on his best form, and I am told that he is going particularly

well in his work at present. Remember that he beat a big field over the same course in the Britannia Stakes last year, and subsequently only failed by a short head to give 101b. to Snooker at Doncaster. He is certainly a likely long shot.


Bright Bird's Pull

Brown Jack is among the probables for the Ascot Vase to-day, but the idea of giving him two races at the meeting will no doubt be abandoned unless the going is reasonably good. With 10st. 4lb. to carry Brown Jack would have to concede 41lb. to Bright Bird, and as Lord Astor's colt is less than 14lb. behind Light Brocade and Campanula—to say nothing of the fact that he ran well in the Guineas—the task would surely be beyond him.

But whatever happens to Brown Jack I fancy we shall see the partner in the famous combination thereabouts in the Ascot Stakes. Donoghue rides Solatium in this long-distance handicap, and at Lambourn they fully expect him to atone for his Queen's Prize defeat. We certainly must give him a big chance, but a doubt as to whether he will like the firm going as much as will Claran leaves a preference for Mr. Sutton's horse.

They Like Hard Ground

Claran has gone up in the handicap since he won the Cosmopolitan Cup at Lingfield, but he only just failed to defy a 10lb. penalty at Epsom, and he was up against a good one in Harinero that day. Within the Law, like Claran, is essentially a hard-ground type who has shown winning form this year, and the conditions will surely suit him better than they

will Roi de Paris, whose trainer will be represented by another past winner in Son of Mint.

Beckhampton cannot win the Coventry Stakes for the fifth year in succession, for the good reason it will not be represented. But with Richards engaged for Hairan it will be a real Ascot surprise if the stable jockey is not again on the winner. Hairan gained a runaway victory on his first appearance. He has the reputation of being the Aga Khan's best two-year-old, and should uphold it against such as Sir Calidore and Pampas Grass.

Richards also looks to have a fine chance of completing the double in the Queen Mary Stakes, as he did last year on Maureen after Medleval Knight had won the Coventry. His mount is Caretta—probably the best two-year-old at Beckhampton at present—and with the conditions favouring the speedy sort, Lord Lonsdale's filly may be in front throughout. Annabel and Sans Facon look the pick of the others.

Lo Zingaro should give the weight successfully in the Prince of Wales's Stakes, but it is by no means a good thing for him to beat Washington, who enjoys a pull of 12lb. Colombo, of course, is considered "past-thepost" for the St. James's Palace Stakes—everywhere, that is, except at Manton. Law Maker had always been thought up to classic standard until he met with the misfortune that appears inseparable from Lord Asto's Derby horses, and now that he is back to form he is fully expected to make Colombo go all the way.

LAYER-OWNER'S ILLNESS

The well-known bookmaker and racehorse owner, Mr. Joseph Cooper, is seriously ill at his home at Newmarket. His condition was stated yesterday to be about the same. He is unconscious.

In partnership with Mr. John Rowson, Mr. Cooper has been one of the principal bookmakers in Tattersall's Ring for many years past. They also own racehorses jointly and won the Great Metropolitan Stakes in 1932 with Roi de Paris, and the Ascot Stakes with the same horse last year.

Probably our best thing, to-morrow, however, is Hairan. He is the best two-year-old trained by Frank Butters and has gone on in quite the right way since scoring in runaway fashion at Manchester.

Sans Facon and Annabel are two smart fillies in the Queen Mary Stakes, of whom I have a slight preference for the last-named.
