FELICITATION RUNS AWAY FROM THE STABLES

WITH GOLD CUP

Three More Winners for the Aga Khan

CREAT things sometimes hang on slender threads in racing. Felicitation ran in the Gold Cup vesterday because he had shown on the previous day that wearing blinkers and allowed to stride out in front he was a different chance of seeing around him. The result was another runaway victory, which brought with it the downfall of the best Derby and St. Leger winner we thought we had for years.

Hyperion failed not only because he did not stay, but because he could not match the speed of Felicitation at any point in the race. Such a good gallop indeed did Richards set that there was a gap of more than a dozen lengths between him and Weston coming out of Swinley Bottom, and, truth to tell, it never looked like being bridged. Hyperion also eventually lost second place to Thor II, but I would not say the French colt deserved that position on merit.

Crapom's Muzzle

Felicitation did not wear a hood in the parade, and Crapom's attendant carried the muzzle the Italian horse had worn in the paddock. The latter's "adornment," I understand, was only there to prevent him picking up his reins when walking round, but he was the only one to give any trouble at the post. For some time after Felicitation's blinkers had been put on, Crapom danced round and round and looked in danger of having made the long journey to get "left."

Happily no such tragedy for the Italian occurred. Actually he was a lot better away than Hyperion. The slight difference in such a race, however, mattered nothing, even though quite a spirited race for the lead between Felicitation and Sans Souci II took them along faster than they usually go in the early stages of a Gold Cup. Crapom's pacemaker had the best of it until passing the stands, when Felicitation definitely got on top, and from that moment nothing ever looked like catching him.

America made the best attempt when Mate cut down the margin on the far side, but before taking the last bend to the straight he had had enough and soon afterwards Hyperion and Young Lover were the pair chasing the leader with Thor II the only other in the picture. For a few strides to the straight it appeared that Young Lover would make up the little ground that separated him from Hyperion, but as with the case of the Derby winner, his stamina gave out and he was just beaten out of a place.

Still They Come

Flying Coot did little flying in the Granville Stakes, but Frank Butters and the very enthusiastic Prince Aly Khan had yet another winner to meet after the Rous Memorial Stakes. This time it was Alishah, and again Richards was in front all the way. The threeyear-old, however, did not have matters all his own way by any means as Disarmament clung to him so grimly that Richards had to ride hard in the last furlong.

A bad place in the draw contributed to the defeat of Vermeil II in the New Stakes—won in good style by Eppie Adair colt—but the green and chocolate hoops went into No. 1 box for the sixth time after the Waterford Stakes. Luck was on the side of Badruddin when he found an opening on the rails after being rather badly placed to the bend, but most things come off for a stable in form.

Brown Jack's attempt to win the Queen Alexandra Stakes for the sixth year in succession puts everything else in the shade to-day, for all except those who regard betting as first and last in racing Brown Jack, with Steve Donoghue in the saddle, is a turf institution. At Ascot he is something even more, and I am looking forward to an unforgettable scene if he wins to-day.

Brown Jack is now ten years of age and in the autumn of his day he is probably set the biggest task he has found in his own particular race. Loosestrife is a much better stayer than any he has met of recent years, and Nitsichin, Our Hope, and Harinero can go all the way. I do hope Brown Jack wins again, but I must say that I am not at all confident about him beating Harinero, who, from all accounts, is fully expected to put an end to his monopoly.

There is no chance of Frank Butters winning the "Brown Jack Stakes," and unless present plans are altered, he will only be concerned with two races. In one of them, the Windsor Castle Stakes, there will be three runners from the stable, and perhaps the best thing of the day in Maltravers, who won so nicely at Newmarket. Barred Umber in the Britannia Stakes is the other runner, but here I prefer Monkshood in a very open race.

TOTE DOUBLE RECORD

Pool on Gold Cup Day at Ascot Exceeds £4,000 for the First Time

The Ascot totalisator takings yesterday amounted to £85,123 8s. and show a decrease of £7,342 16s. compared with Gold Cup day last year, this being due no doubt to the weather conditions, as the rain kept many people under chelton.

The takings on the Gold Cup were £20,296 14s., considerably less than had been invested on the Royal Hunt Cup, but the pool for the totalisator daily double was a record, and amounted to £4,037 10s., this being the first occasion it has ever topped £4,000, the previous record for a daily double having been on Cambridgeshire day in 1930, when £3,954 was taken.

The total for the first three days at Ascot is £236,975 14s., compared with £231,042 14s, for the first three days of the meeting last year.

DEATH OF MR. J. COOPER

Mr. Joseph Cooper, the well-known book-maker and racehorse owner, died at his home at Newmarket yesterday.

Mr. Cooper was in partnership with Mr. John Rawson, and their best horse was Roi de Paris, which won the Great Metropolitan Stakes at Epsom in 1932, and last year was successful in the Ascot Stakes.
