## ROYAL VISIT TO SANDOWN

**Maltravers Avenges Ascot Defeat**  
**BADRUDDIN AGAIN**

THE King and Queen are to visit Sandown Park to-day, when Windsor Lad is to attempt to emulate Coronach by adding the Eclipse Stakes to his Derby victory. It goes without saying that he is confidently expected to win, but it does not follow that it is a good thing for the colt to give 10lb. to Umidwar or 3lb. to Alishah over this distance. And there is also his one-time galloping companion, King Salmon, to be considered, to say nothing of Canon Law, who has always been thought a good colt at Manton, where they set a very high standard.

Windsor Lad missed Ascot so that he could have an "easy" before going into strong work for to-day's race. It was probably a very wise decision on the part of Marcus Marsh, for we know what happened to the cracks at Ascot, and what has happened to so many of them since. Windsor Lad will certainly be fresh as well as fit, which is a big consideration in a race of this sort.

### Likes a Race

There is still a wide difference of opinion as to how Windsor Lad stands with some Derby winners of recent years. My view will always be that Colombo was unlucky at Epsom, but that does not mean that he would surely have beaten Windsor Lad but for the misfortune he met with in running. Some horses—and they are nearly always good ones—would make a race with a donkey, and those who know most about Windsor Lad aver that he will do no more than is absolutely necessary.

At Lambourn, where Windsor Lad is trained, they are expecting to see the Derby winner first and King Salmon second; at Newmarket the experts think that the Aga Khan's pair, Umidwar and Alishah will both be in the first three. A pull of 10lb. should surely put Umidwar much closer to Windsor Lad than was the case in the Derby, yet the fact remains that this colt's reputation has been built up on home estimate of his ability rather than what he has accomplished in public.

### Stable Problems

On the other hand, Alishah was decidedly unlucky in the Derby—in which Perryman lost his irons—and he did show that he can win when scoring comfortably afterwards at Ascot. The latest gallop between the pair suggests Umidwar as the better, but I do like the public test, and that points to Alishah. Canon Law might have been a bigger danger if rain had fallen earlier, and the spell of dry weather must also tell against Lo Zingaro.

Sethos and Black Tulip—the latter a stable companion to Windsor Lad—should run well in the Victoria Handicap, but it is not a good thing for either of them to beat Meldrum. Boyd Rochfort's colt has been ridden by light weights in his recent races, and the powerful persuasion of Joe Childs may make a lot of difference. Beattie, from the same stable, should be kept on the safe side in the Great Kingston Plate, for which the newcomer, Felassa, is well spoken of.

Umidwar finished three or four lengths in front. There is no doubt in my mind that this horse has greatly improved since he ran in the Derby.

Phaleron Bay has missed one or two engagements to run here. He is very well, but hardly looks good enough to win.

Felassa, a son of Felstead, makes his first appearance in the Great Kingston Two-year-old Plate. He has been going well at exercise, and is expected to give a good account of himself.

With all her weight Faria should be well on the mark in the Surbiton Handicap. She was an easy winner of the Gosforth Park Cup, and will trouble the best of them.

Since running in the London Cup at Alexandra Park Meldrum has given satisfaction, and his turn may come in the Victoria Handicap. HEATHMAN.

### LOSS TO RACING

News was received at Lanark yesterday of the deaths of two of the leading patrons of Mr. Dobson Peacock's stables at Middleham, Mr. W. Kincaid-Lennox and Mr. W. R. Smith. Both were staunch supporters of the north of England and Scottish race-meetings.

Mr. Kincaid-Lennox had the distinction of breeding the Grand National winner of 1911, Glenside, but it was in Mr. P. Bibby's colours that the horse won the great steeplechase. Mr. Kincaid-Lennox also bred Twelve Pointer, who won the Cambridgeshire in 1924.

Undoubtedly Mr. Smith's best racehorse was Heronslea. Another good horse owned by him was Berestol.
