ROYAL VISIT TO SANDOWN

Maltravers Avenges **Ascot Defeat**

BADRUDDIN AGAIN

THE King and Queen are to visit Sandown Park to-day, when Windsor Lad is to attempt to emulate Coronach by adding the Eclipse Stakes to his Derby victory. It goes without saying that he is confidently expected to win, but it does not follow that it is a good thing for the colt to give 10lb. to Umidwar or 3lb. to Ali-

shah over this distance. And there is also his one-time galloping companion, King Salmon, to be considered, to say nothing of Canon Law, who has always been thought a good colt at Manton, where they set a very high standard.

Windsor Lad missed Ascot so that he could nave an "easy" before going into strong work for to-day's race. It was probably a very wise decision on the part of Marcus Marsh, for we know what happened to the cracks at Ascot, and what has happened to so many of them since. Windsor Lad will certainly be fresh as well as fit, which is a big consideration in a race of this sort.

Likes a Race

There is still a wide difference of opinion as to how Windsor Lad stands with some Derby to how Windsor Lad stands with some Derby winners of recent years. My view will always be that Colombo was unlucky at Epsom, but that does not mean that he would surely have beaten Windsor Lad but for the misfortune he met with in running. Some horses—and they are nearly always good ones—would make a race with a donkey, and those who know most about Windsor Lad aver that he will do no more than is absolutely necessary.

At Lambourn, where Windsor Lad is trained, they are expecting to see the Derby winner first and King Salmon second; at Newmarket the experts think that the Aga Khan's pair, Umidwar and Alishah will both be in the first three. A pull of 10lb, should surely put Umidwar much closer to Windsor Lad than was the case in the Derby, yet the fact remains that this colt's reputation has been built up on home estimate of his ability rather than what he has accomplished in public. plished in public.

Stable Problems

On the other hand, Alishah was decidedly unlucky in the Derby—in which Perryman lost his irons—and he did show that he can win when scoring comfortably afterwards at Ascot. The latest gallop between the pair suggests Umidwar as the better, but I do like the public test, and that points to Alishah. Canon Law might have been a bigger danger if rain had fallen earlier, and the spell of dry weather must also tell against Lo Zingaro.

Sethos and Black Tulip—the latter a stable companion to Windsor Lad—should run well in the Victoria Handicap, but it is not a good thing for either of them to beat Meldrum. Boyd Rochfort's colt has been ridden by light weights in his recent races, and the powerful persuasion of Joe Childs may make a lot of difference. Beatit, from the same stable, should be kept on the safe side in the Great Kingston Plate, for which the newcomer. Felassa, is well spoken of.

Two for Fox

Fred Fox—another of our youthful veterans—also came out on top on Badruddin in a great finish for the Midsummer Stakes and completed a double for Frank Butters when Malravers upset the odds laid on his starle companion Alykhan in the Chesterfield Stakes. Alykhan had finished in front of Mr. Lant's colt in their placings behind Theft, at Ascot, but he had the worst of the draw on that occasion and ran well from a bad position.

Second thoughts did not prove best in the Summer Handicap when Claran was made favourite after Silver Jubilee had held the position for some time. Claran was well beaten a long way out, and sheer stamina and pluck enabled Silver Jubilee to hold off the equally game veteran Lanson. The last-named is now ten years of age, but his turn should come again right enough before the season is much older.

Early Closing and Early Rising, two sons of Duncan Gray, owned by Lord Portman and ridden by Beary, brought off a nice double at Bath. The former triumphed over many difficulties to win the Blathwayt Handicap, but the two-year-old had a very smooth journey in the Maiden Plate. Press Cutting showed up well in the latter race, and should win for Beckhampton when the stable's luck changes.
