ROSEMARY'S PET JUST HOME AT AINTREE

Fairhaven Scores a Popular Win **ADEPT'S FIRST**

ROSEMARY'S PET, second last year to Gold Bridge, went one better yesterday in winning the Molyneux Cup after a race that provided all the thrills one expects from sprinters of the top class. Figaro was second, but so close was the finish that we were left guessing which had won until the judge signalled a short-head victory for Carslake's

Figaro started at a much better price than might have been anticipated, chiefly because of the faith in Richards to induce Flying Coot to put her best foot forward all the way. But it was not one of the filly's good days, and she lost her place before half the distance had been covered. Valkyrie kept Morstone out of third place without threatening real danger to the first two in the closing stages.

Goodwood Next

Figaro will now, no doubt, attempt to find consolation in the Stewards' Cup next week, and as almost a winner without a penalty his bright prospects are obvious. Still, it has to be pointed out that although Goodwood is an easy course, five furlongs suits Figaro better than six, and more than many others in the field his chance will be influenced very largely by the state of the going—and the draw.

A year ago Old Riley came out the same horse as Rosemary's Pet at Liverpool, and yesterday's form shows Mr. Joel's horse to be 4lb. better than Figaro. At Goodwood next week Old Riley has to give Figaro only 1lb., and with the Ascot proof that Old Riley is touching his best form again, it looks as if it must be a near thing between them next week.

Easy Money

Adept found the winning post for the first time in the St. George Stakes, which proved a tame affair for such a nice prize. Until Richards got tired of ambling behind Osman Pasha on Democrat the three horses went along at a crawl. When Democrat went on so did Adept, and going to the front halfway up the straight Lord Astor's colt easily held off a final effort by Osman Pasha.

Lord Derby's colours found Dame Fortune in a more benign mood than she has been for some time, and a welcome and popular double was scored by Fairhaven and Bunker. Phlox was heavily backed to beat the former in the Mersey Stakes, but it was not Richards's lucky day and he finished among the also rans. Bunker's victory gave Weston his third success, as he also scored on Dennisore, who ran instead of Integrity in the Grassmere Plate.

Better Late-

Roseate's victory in the Church House Handicap reminded me that he was also a winner here on Forbra's National day—to the great joy of a friend who won £282 with a 10s. ticket in the tote double. Roseate did not win another race in eleven subsequent attempts that year.

Last season he failed nine times, and as he had been unplaced on five occasions this year he was certainly not winning out of his turn.

Canaletto, for whom much bigger things were anticipated in his younger days, started favourite, but even in this moderate company
