 WITH a total of close on £48,000 Frank Butters has already won nearly three times the amount credited to any other trainer in stake money. How much farther will he have gone ahead when his "fleet" returns from Goodwood, where so many of the stable cracks are engaged this week?

The first half of the Sussex fortnight was at one time the period in which Beekhampton was the stable one and all looked to for winners. No doubt there will be one or two from that quarter this week, but at Newmarket they are expecting it to be "Ascot all over again" for the Aga Khan's trainer.

**Great Team**  
 Umidwar, Bahram, Theft, Perfect Picture, Badruddin, Hilla, Mrs. Rustom, La Galette and Light Brocade are the principal members of a wonderful team, and with a little picking and choosing possible where several of them are concerned the prospects certainly do appear rosy. And for the most part it looks as if we shall be spared the possibility of a surprise by the stable outsider.

With only Law Maker and Lo Zingaro to beat, Umidwar looks to have the softest task of all in the Gratwicke Stakes to-morrow. The pair with most to do are Theft and Hilla, who will be up against the Beekhampton cracks Ben Marshall and Caretta respectively. But the Aga Khan upset Manitoba with Moti Begum in 1932, and Maureen with Mrs. Rustom last year, and with luck still running the way of the green and chocolate hoops the hat-trick may easily be completed.

**One Certain Blank**  
 One of the few races in which there is no possibility of a Butters victory is the Stewards' Cup. He has left that sprint to others, which

will not lessen the disappointment that awaits many of his optimistic colleagues to-morrow. From Coroado at the top of the handicap to The Old Pretender at the bottom nearly everything seems to be well fancied in this very open handicap, and unless the 1914 dead-heat is repeated there can be only one winner.

Coroado was still favourite at the last call-over, but whether he will keep his place to-day is very doubtful. And unless he gets one of the high numbers in the draw—an all-important consideration in Goodwood sprints—he is sure to lose it. That Donoghue is lost to North Devon because he is required for Furrokh Siyar is going to bring a lot of notice to Mumtaz Mahal's son, and I have an idea we shall hear a bit more about Greenore.

**His Second Visit**  
 Furrokh Siyar will be remembered for his first visit to Goodwood as well as for his great fight against Gold Bridge at Ascot recently. Two years ago he came from France for the King George Stakes, started a warm favourite and was not in the first three behind Christine. As the latter gave 5lb. and will be receiving 3lb. in spite of his penalty, Furrokh Siyar does not look a good thing to beat the grey.

Another of the same colour I have a wholesome respect for is Strathcarron, particularly as he is to be ridden by Harry Wragg. On the July Cup running he has a really good chance, and I should say that this course would suit him better than Newmarket. Then there is Old Riley, whose turn is over-long delayed. At the moment I must say I like the latter as much as anything, for there is no doubt that he is well handicapped on his best form.

**Nicoll in Form**  
 The South African jockey, G. Nicoll, had his most successful afternoon since his arrival in this country at the beginning of last season, when he added three points to his winning aggregate at Hurst Park on Saturday. He won on Tweedledum and Chatelaine, and dead-heated on Lord Gordon. But the feature of the afternoon was the defeat of Spend a Penny in the Duchess of York Plate. Short odds were taken about Sir Alfred Butt's filly, but she actually finished last. Armour Bright and Damascus fought out a great finish, and in the last few strides Armour Bright got up to win by a short head.

Gordon Richards brought off a double event at Worcester on Midi and Celebrant. Midi scored with a lot in hand, for going to the front in the straight, he drew away from the others and had four lengths to spare at the finish. In the City Handicap Celebrant made

nearly all the running, and Richards, with 108 winners, now holds a lead of thirty-seven over Nevett.

Fartuch was staying on well to win the Abergavenny Plate at Lewes, and this form indicates her as the likely winner of the Midsummer Plate at Worcester to-day. Another likely winner this afternoon is Yellow Peril in the Worcestershire Stakes. I base this assumption on what I saw him do in the race won by Venerly at Salisbury. The price may not be over generous, but we ought not to miss what looks like a real opportunity.

## WALK RECORD BY G. T. GALLOWAY

### Famous Athlete Wins Two Miles Race

In winning the two miles walking championship, in 14m. 58s., at the T.O.T. (London Transport) sports, at Chiswick, on Saturday, G. T. Galloway (Chiswick General), the world's record holder for three hours walking, beat the previous best for the event by one second.

Both L. J. Manwaring (District Railway) (5ft. 7in.) and A. W. Collard (Chiswick General) (5ft. 6in.) beat the record for the high jump championship.

Metropolitan Railway, who were competing for the first time, won the Aggregate Trophy by one point from the holders, Chiswick General.

Three of England's Empire Games representatives were successful in events at the Jubilee sports meeting held by the Salford Harriers at Fallowfield, Manchester.

### MILE FOR WHITEHEAD

C. Whitehead, the Salford harrier, easily retained his Lancashire County one mile title in 4m. 32.2-5s.: T. Evenson (Manchester A.C.) won the one and half mile steeplechase handicap, from scratch, in 7m. 51.2-5s.; and Jack Sibbit (Manchester W.) took the three miles scratch cycle race in 7m. 49.4-5s.

Sprinters were afforded an excellent opportunity to show their paces at the White City Stadium on Saturday, when the programme of the City of London Police A.C. sports included no fewer than eight short-distance events.

With a following breeze some fast times were returned in the open 100 yards, the final of which was won by K. H. Robinson (Finchley H.) (8½ yards) in 9-4-5s.

In the invitation short limit handicap C. A. Ward (Blackheath H.) (2 yards) showed 9-9-10s., thus repeating his win in the corresponding event last year.

Miss E. M. Hiscock, the Women's A.A.A. champion, secured third place from the back mark of 1½ yards in the 100 yards women's handicap, which was won by Miss D. Simmonds (1½ yards), and Miss M. M. Menzies took the 220 yards women's handicap from the 10 yards mark.

### PAGE TURNS OUT

E. L. Page, the A.A.A. ex-champion, again assisted the Metropolitan Police "A" team to win the 880 yards police relay championship. City and Hospitals athletes competed at the charity sports meeting at Moots Park, when Insurance A.A. retained the Financial Times Challenge Shield with a total of 29½ points.

Inter-Banks A.A., who have won the trophy on eight occasions, were runners-up with 23 points, while Stock Exchange A.C. were third with 14 points.

United Hospitals A.C. (4½ points) and London Shipping A.A. (1 point) also took part in the contest, which produced one new record when H. A. Hake, the well-known Stock Exchange long-distance walker, won the two miles walk in 13m. 58.3-5s. to improve by 3-5s. on his own previous record for the meeting.

### TITLE FOR EDGE

P. Edge (Birmingham) won the Midland Road-Walking Association twenty miles championship at Halesowen on Saturday in 2h. 50m. 11s., which was four minutes better than the time of T. W. Green last year.
