Great Team

Umidwar, Bahram, Theft, Perfect Picture, Badruddin, Hilla, Mrs. Rustom, La Gaiete and Light Brocade are the principal members of a wonderful team, and with a little picking and choosing possible where several of them are concerned the prospects certainly do appear rosy. And for the most part it looks as if we shall be spared the possibility of a surprise by the stable outsider.

With only Law Maker and Lo Zingaro to beat, Umidwar looks to have the softest task of all in the Gratwicke Stakes to-morrow. The pair with most to do are Theft and Hilla, who will be up against the Beckhampton cracks Ben Marshall and Caretta respectively. But the Aga Khan upset Manitoba with Moti Begum in 1932, and Maureen with Mrs. Rustom last year, and with luck still running the way of the green and chocolate hoops the hat-trick may easily be completed.

One Certain Blank

One of the few races in which there is no possibility of a Butters victory is the Stewards' Cup. He has left that sprint to others, which
