Clever York Victory for Harem

GUILDHALL WINS

THERE is to be a memorial to Brown Jack at Ascot. What will Chapstow do about Gordon Richards after his latest achievement. All riding records were shattered there a year ago when he won eleven races to complete a sequence of twelve off the reel. That wonderful performance was too good to be approached, but three more winners yesterday gave him seven at the meeting and a total, including the Nottingham hat-trick, of ten in three days.

Such was the Richards glamour last year at a time when the champion was hot on the trail of Archer's record that no fewer than ten of his eleven winners were warm favourites. Only two of his mounts occupied that market position on Wednesday, and yesterday the bookmakers took risks with his mount on more than one occasion.

Seven Off the Reel

They certainly did so in offering 9 to 2 about On Wings for the Langibby Plate. This youngster was receiving a nice bit of weight from Theio and, making the most of the advantage, Richards began as he had finished the previous day with a comfortable victory. Cook General and Big Bad Wolf followed to make it seven off the reel and give an uncomfortable feeling to those bookmakers with "mixed-double" commissions for all Richards's mounts.

As it turned out, however, their worries were over. Galadale, a much improved three-year-old broke the sequence by beating Democrat in the Welsh St. Leger; Cape Race found the outsider Forelock too good in the Hughes Morgan Nursery, and to complete a hat trick of seconds Tom Bowling went under by a head to Abaris in the Moonmouth Handicap.

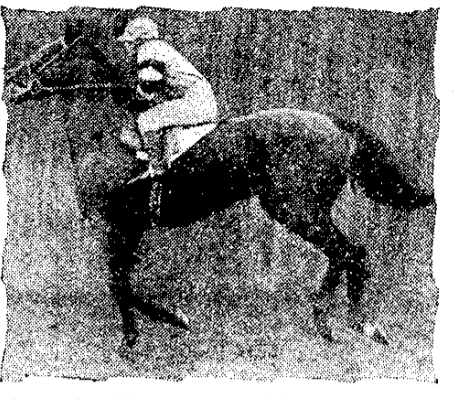
Turn for Manton

One of the few turns that has come the way of Manton lately occurred at York, where the lightly-weighted Harem gained a clever victory in the Little-Go Plate. A good beginning gave the three-year-old an advantage of several others, and Sharpe did the right thing in making the most of it. In the end there was only a head to spare from Commander III, and Blackmail was less than that away third.

Spend a Penny ran well to finish close up fourth, but her owner's luck will have to change if she is to come into the Cambridgeshire picture. Blue Brocade showed fine speed in the early stages and another prize should come her way when she tackles a race round about six furlongs.

Two for the North

The north had a turn when Guildhall gained an easy victory in the Rawcliffe Nursery, starting at the nice price of 7 to 1. The colt had shown good speed behind Credenda filly at Doncaster and the promise of that performance was fulfilled to the letter when he jumped off

After Guildhall it was the turn of Boethius to show that the north can win races, and did so in a manner that left no room for "inquests." They have always had a big opinion of this colt at Middleham, and it looks as if it is going to be vindicated in spite of recent defeats over sprint courses.

Haydock Pointers

Royal Crusade, who gained such a spectacular victory at Nottingham on Tuesday, will again be one of Gordon Richards's mounts at Haydock to-day, but he will find himself in different company and a penalty should stop him. On Top and Bridge Law are both well spoken of, but I have an idea that Hoplite will be found capable of conceding the weight all round.

Richards's best chance appears to rest with Madame La Capitaine in the Earlstown Plate, although Hellenize will not have to be a world beater to win the Maiden Handicap. Denbigh and Highlander meet in the Golborne Sweepstakes and as the former has a pull of 16lb, according to the Cambridgeshire Handicap he should justify Middleham opinion that he represents a good thing.

Now that the ground is softening we can look to Riff winning a race. She must be noted for the Maiden Handicap. Nothing like the best was seen of Miss Gallipoli when unplaced at Doncaster. She is worth noting for the Glazebrook Selling Handicap, and may come up at a nice price.

Bargain, a stable companion of Miss Gallipoli, is engaged in the Earlstown Selling Plate. He has yet to win a race, but ran very prominently behind Pride of Wansland and Mibreth at Yarmouth. Highlander has a consistent record since winning over the course in June. He should be given another chance in the Golborne Sweepstakes.

WELL-KNOWN TRAINER DEAD

Mr. Thomas Smalley, of Winchester, Passes Away After Long Illness

Mr. Thomas Smalley, the well-known Winchester racehorse trainer, died yesterday after a long illness. He was forty-four years of age. Smalley was born at Wigan, in Lancashire, and served his early apprenticeship to racing in the north with R. Robson. He succeeded E. de Mestre as trainer at Winchester on the last-named's death in 1932. His principal winner this season was the two-year-old Domum, with which he won five races. His last success was at Nottingham on Tuesday, when he won the Welbeck Plate with Tremando.
