This youngster was receiving a nice bit of weight from Theio and, making the most of the advantage, Richards began as he had finished the previous day with a comfortable victory. Cook General and Big Bad Wolf followed to make it seven off the reel and give an uncomfortable feeling to those bookmakers with "mixed-double" commissions for all Richards's mounts.

As it turned out, however, their worries were over. Galadale, a much improved three-year-old broke the sequence by beating Democrat in the Welsh St. Leger; Cape Race found the outsider Forelock too good in the Hughes Morgan Nursery, and to complete a hat trick of seconds Tom Bowling went under by a head to Abaris in the Monmouth Handicap.

#### Turn for Manton

One of the few turns that has come the way of Manton lately occurred at York, where the lightly-weighted Harem gained a clever victory in the Little-Go Plate. A good beginning gave the three-year-old an advantage of several others, and Sharpe did the right thing in making the most of it. In the end there was only a head to spare from Commander III, and Blackmail was less than that away third.


