Fine Week Anticipated for Manton

UMIDWAR'S TASK

After the glowing reports from Newmarket concerning Enfield's progress I was quite prepared to see Solar Boy eventually ousted from favouritism for the Cesarewitch, but I must confess that I was hardly prepared for such a quick change over as that which took place at yesterday's call over. From 100 to 9-and 15 to 1 a week

ago-Enfield's price was cut to 8 to 1, and if conditions remain as they are at present it will be shorter than that when the numbers go into the frame. Sirett rides Captain Boyd-Rochfort's candidate.

One thing we do know about Enfield is that he is in no way handicapped by firm ground. On the other hand, Solar Boy, Hands Off, Polly Stephens and Roi de Paris all prefer it on the soft side, and only an abnormal rainfall would put the going in that state to-morrow. At present the course is in well-nigh perfect condition, and indications are that it will remain so.

Too Firm

Already Martin Hartigan has decided that the ground is too firm for the veteran Saint Reynard, and although none of the others I have mentioned will stay away for the same reason it is obvious that their chances must be affected. Roi de Paris in particular looks like being at a big disadvantage, and it will not surprise me to see a swing round in favour of Cotoneaster at the expense of her stable companion. Solar Boy.

Cotoneaster, like Enfield, has shown her best form on firn, going, and although beaten at the last meeting she was by no means disgraced. In her case it is chiefly a question whether she possesses the stamina for a 2½ mile race across the stiffest gallop in England. No such doubts exist where Enfield is concerned. In his case the problem is whether the handicapper originally really gave him 10lb. too little.

That "Mixed" Gallop

Apart from Enfield and Solar Boy the pair Apart from Enfield and Solar Boy the pair that continue to interest the professional element are Spring Morning and Polly Stephens. The latter according to all accounts did a bit more in that Manton spin than was suggested at the time. On the other hand mixed gallops are often misleading and it must be a bit against Polly Stephens that she has not had a race since the spring.

The three I like most at the moment are Spring Morning Enfield and Cotoneaster, with a slight preference for the first-named. Hard ground kept her off a raceccurse for most of the summer, but she has come back to her best form since conditions changed, and with better luck in running might have been first instead of fourth at Nottingham last week.

Change of Luck?

Recent doings of Manton horses indicate a change in the luck of a stable that, like Beckhampton, has been out of touch with fortune for most of the year. It is doubtful if Dona Sol or Shining Cloud will be quite good enough for the big race, but there will surely be some winners among the many others that go to Newmarket this week.

With another furlong to go compared with his race at the previous meeting, Sevrier is quite likely to lead off a winner in the Alington Stakes, and Beresfell—also beaten by Maltravers a fortright ago—has a nice chance of going one better in the Clearwell Stakes. Fresh Fox will be an obvious danger if saddled

An old rival in Lo Zingaro will oppose Umidwar to-day, and over a shorter distance it is expected that he will give the Aga Khan's colt a lot more to do than he did a fortnight ago. Denbigh, who is now finding his real form, Master Vere, and Law Maker will help to make it one of the J st races of the week, but I doubt that any of them will beat Umidwar.

One Who Will Stay

Arbitration, Sans Atout and Remorse are three youngsters well spoken of for the Ditch Mile Nursery, but the one they all have to beat is Voilino. This colt has been second in each of his last two races, and at least we know he will stay the distance. Poet's Pride has a good weight for a three-year-old in the Visitors' Handicap, but horses of this age are doing well at present, and I liked the way she ran on against Blackmail and Flamenco at Doncaster.

Pip Emma looks like starting favourite for the Newmarket Oaks, but it will not surprise me to see her beaten by Miss Erene. This three-year-old has had only one race this season, and Manton opinion is that Lawson's patience with a promising filly will be rewarded to-day, and perhaps again before the end of the season
