Whiteplains the Best Outsider

MANTON IN LUCK

By BOUVERIE THE great flying week at nearby Mildenhall, where preparations are going on apace for the Australian flight, has helped to bring more people to Newmarket than the famous little Suffolk town has seen since the big racing boom that followed the war.

Visitors for to-day's Cesarewitch, more air-minded than versed in racing, will find a topical tip in Shining Cloud. With a little imagination they might include Solar Boy and Rising Sun.

Enfield's Penalty Rightly or wrongly, I feel that the conditions will not suit Solar Boy, and in the belief that Enfield's penalty will stop him, as it has stopped so many Newbury winners, I am looking to Spring Morning and Cotoneaster as the pair most likely to provide the winner.

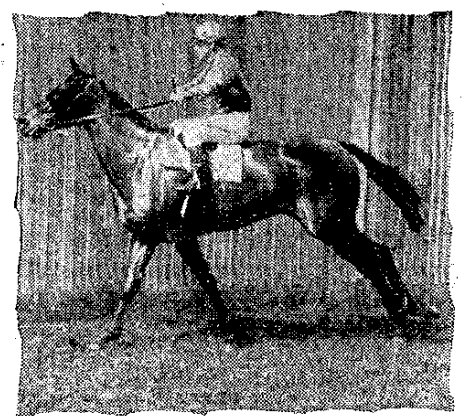
The Lucky Jockey Still the choice has to be made, and the one I am picking is Spring Morning, because luck is so often with Johnny Dines in big races. She is in the right part of the handicap, and her weight may enable her to pull out the bit extra if it comes to a tight finish on the final climb.

Roi de Paris, Hands Off and the lightly weighted northerner, Jack Tar, all have reasonably good chances on their best form, and I can assure those who fancy any of them that their ideas are shared in the respective stables. There are too many "likely long shots" for one to suggest one of them, but if I had to it would be Whiteplains.

Easton reappears in the Select Stakes, and as this mile should suit him, this ought to be one winner among the several Beckhampton runners during the afternoon. Another with an obvious chance is Caretta, although at six furlongs she may not give 14lb. to Mannerism, one of the many Manton youngsters who have been held up by the hard ground.

Umidwar Again Umidwar duly carried on the good work for the Aga Khan and Frank Butters by winning the Champion Stakes yesterday, a clear-cut success that made us wonder once more how fortunate were Colombo and Windsor Lad in the fact that this good three-year-old found his real form all too late. Several in the field looked like "giving him a race" yesterday for a mile, but after that it was all plain sailing.

Badruddin appeared as dangerous as anything going into the dip, and it will not surprise me if after all this grey becomes the chief stable hope for the Cambridgeshire. Campanula ran a good race after being rather awkward before the start, but Lo Zingaro was never

in the picture. Evidently the Beckhampton colt is tired of racing, for the time being at any rate.

Manton's luck has definitely changed. Although drawn in the worst position of all in a big field, Sevrier gained a stylish victory in the Ailington Stakes. Beresfell had a bit more to do in the Clearwell Stakes against Beattit, but he did enough to complete a double. A newcomer from Beckhampton, named Harmony Hall, shaped well against Sevrier, and Blue Pencil, also in the same colours, was third to Beresfell. Both should win races, and so should Ringleader, who led Sevrier for quite a long way.

After the two-year-olds it was the turn of a senior to complete a Manton treble by winning the Newmarket Oaks. The heroine here was Miss Erene, and the hero Freddie Fox, who rode a fine finish to hold off Harry Wragg on Pip Emma. Miss Erene had only run once previously this season, and Lawson's patience with a promising filly might find further reward before the season is out.

Fox's Hat Trick

Number four for Manton came when Miss Onslow filly won the Ditch Mile Nursery, and so enabled Fred Fox to complete a hat trick. To prove that it never rains but that it pours in a double sense, a heavy downpour from lowering clouds blotted out most of the running, but we distinguished enough in the far away finish to see that Voilino had once again got so near and yet so far. Why do races at Newmarket still finish a quarter of a mile from the stands?

In the absence of Foet's Pride, Celestial City was favourite for the Visitors' Handicap. Fox asserted himself with little trouble to take an early lead on Gamesmaster, but a quarter of a mile from home Gordon Richards put in a strong effort on Celestial City, and the champion was always master of the situation afterwards.

STABLE NEWS

Fancies from Newmarket and Chief Provincial Centres

NEWMARKET, Tuesday. Our likely runners for the Cesarewitch have come through a preparation to the satisfaction of all concerned. Whiteplains is a very good stayer, and will be running on at the finish. The conditions have come to suit Hands Off, who is bound to be there at the finish. Connections are now satisfied that all is well with Enfield, who is still nicely weighted, despite the 10lb. penalty. Lady Clodagh ran very well in the Newbury Cup, and she is expected to do so here. However, I like nothing trained here so well as Enfield. In her two races at Manchester and Haydock The Tatler ran fairly well, and he may be good enough for the Witchford Selling Plate. Queen of Hearts, from the same stable, was a clever winner at Pontefract, and is worth notice for the Second October Nursery.

FROM OTHER QUARTERS

Manton.—Mannerism (2.30) is regarded as good. Shining Cloud (3.15) should finish in the first three. Woodhouse (4.15) is fancied. Beckhampton.—Easton (2.0) should win. Caretta (2.30) and Foxab (4.15) are fancied. Ogbourne.—Wantalot (4.15) is under orders for Newmarket. Lambourn.—Runners from here for the Cesarewitch are Cotoneaster, Solar Boy, Spring Morning and Venerly. Solar Boy may prove best. Cartolina (3.45) is fancied.
