# **Donoghue Brings Off** 106 to 1 Double

# SEA JOY'S TURN

#### By BOUVERIE

MANY more days like Lingfield, and it will be the turn of backers to seek the assistance of the tote! Even the "extra-turn" match between Sea Joy and Sea Light saw the downfall of the favourite. Donoghue won the chief prizes on Democrat and Zelina, and so few anticipated such results that the odds against the double were 106 to 1.

And the idea of help from the tote for backers is not so extravagant as it might at first appear. In its earliest days an attempt was made to run the tote on a deduction of only 6 per cent. from the total pools. That was soon found to be nothing like sufficient to make ends nearly meet, and it was soon increased to 10 per cent.—which is still less than the stoppage made in France.

#### "Broken" Money

"Broken" Money

But a further levy was made with the decision to pay dividends to the nearest 3d. below the accurate reckoning. It has been estimated that this "broken" money has the effect of increasing the tote's percentage to more than 12 per cent. These "economies" were effected at the expense of backers when things were bad. Now times are better; grants have already been made out of surplus funds, and more are being sought. Will it be surprising if the public who find the money also seek a little "assistance" in the shape of a reduction in the percentage deducted?

Galadale went the way of most "handicap certainties" at Lingfield. On the Chepstow form the one horse he did appear certain to beat was Democrat, who, receiving 12lb., was well beaten in the Welsh St. Leger. But, although getting six pounds this time, Mrs Corlette Glorney's colt made all the running, and Galadale could only finish third a neck behind Amoretto. Obviously the shorter distance and the easier course was against Galadale.

#### Zelina's Courage

Zelina, the outsider of three runners, well merited her success in the Autumn Oaks. Donoghue rode her as only Steve can handle a filly set a big task, and she answered his calls with fine resolution to beat the Manton favourite Cattewater, who was in receipt of 23lb. The loser has not had much experience of racing and might have made a much closer fight of it had she known more about it, as she should next time out.

French Kiss filly, who had previously shown a liking for the course, scored a clever victory in the October Nursery at the expense of West Highland. Masquerader, a stable companion of West Highland, dead-heated with Gleamer for third place—a good performance in that he was drawn on the worst side of the course.

The match at level weights over five furlongs between Sea Light and Sea Joy proved a thoroughly sporting one, and when the horses returned their respective trainers, Briscoe and John Nightingall, shook hands and exclaimed in the same breath, "Jolly good race." Sea Light had the call in the betting, but Sea Joy got slightly the better of the start, and, making all the running, won by three-parts of a length. The pair had met four times previously this season, and it was a case of honours easy between the pair.



Time and events have proved Corbett to be much the more skilful boxer. He will never have the punch or power of King, and a little luck on the Manchester man's side is always liable to turn the scale.

In short, King can punch his way to victory, over a slightly inferior Corbett. Corbett can successfully defend himself, and pile up sufficient points with his impeccable straight left against all but the most desperate and determined King.

A draw, of course, still actuates in favour of Corbett, who defends two titles—the British and the Empire.
