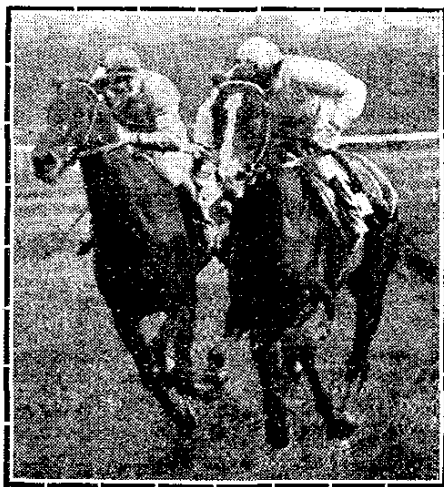

Masquerader, a stable companion of West Highland, dead-heated with Gleamer for third place—a good performance in that he was drawn on the worst side of the course.

The match at level weights over five furlongs between Sea Light and Sea Joy proved a thoroughly sporting one, and when the horses returned their respective trainers, Briscoe and John Nightingall, shook hands and exclaimed in the same breath, "Jolly good race."
