BIG CLAIMS OF MARY TUDOR

Prospects of Another "Butters Week"

OVERALL'S WIN

THOSE who fancy Mary Tudor II for the Cambridgeshire will be delighted to learn that the uncertainty regarding a jockey has been settled. Steve Donoghue has been released from riding Homily, and he will steer the French filly on Wednesday. Steve rode Mary Tudor II in a good gallop of a mile at Newmarket on Saturday, and she shaped quite well against the two horses that accompanied her.

Mary Tudor II went to the head of the betting immediately it was decided that she should take her chance, and the business done, apart from that recorded at the Club call-overs, has been most significant. It may be stretching a point to suggest that she is regarded as another Palais Royal II, but there is not a shadow of doubt that a lot of money will go to France if she wins.

As the heroine of the French One Thousand Guineas, an unlucky loser in the Oaks at Chantilly, and a good winner since, Mary Tudor II is undoubtedly well treated on her best form. Buckland, who figures on the same mark, is a long way behind the classic form on this side, and English standard may not be very far in front of that on the other side.

Class Counts

A top-class three-year-old is always to be feared in the Cambridgeshire. Happily we also can produce a few of that sort in Flammeno, Badruddin and Wychwood Abbot. Spend a Penny may also be included without an undue stretch of imagination, because she was thought right in the top flight at the beginning of the season, and 28lb. below top weight is a dangerous mark for an Ascot winner of any sort.

It never does to leave out Frank Butters these days, but I should not like to choose between Badruddin and Spend a Penny before the draw—and with equal luck in that respect I should have a decided preference for Flammeno. I have seen Lord Rosebery's colt referred to as "only a miler," but the book shows that he gave Windsor Lad a very good race over a furlong further than the distance of the Cambridgeshire early in the year.

Stable Problems

Like Butters, the Stockbridge trainer Easterbee has a stable problem. It concerns Caymanus and Grand Rounds, who have both been well in the limelight—in the betting sense—during the last few days. A home gallop, following a dead-heat in a very minor race at Newbury, is said to have shown Grand Rounds to great advantage. It may have done, but I cannot bring myself to regard her as likely to beat Caymanus on Wednesday.

Whether Badruddin and Spend a Penny succeed or fail in the big handicap it should be another great week for Frank Butters. Felicitation runs his last race in the Jockey Club Cup and it will be a staggering surprise if he does not score a farewell victory. Hairan, in the Dewhurst Stakes, may be only one of several two-year-old winners from the stable, and we may see Master Vere resume his successful sequence in the Limekiln Stakes.

With a little luck Butters might have won the Newbury Handicap with Robber Chief on Saturday. Sir Alfred Butt's colt did not have

the best of luck in running and, finishing very fast, failed by only a length to catch Overall. Chiefly because the public had backed him in the ante-post lists Mr. Lant allowed Achtenan to take his chance, but the slight rain that fell still left the ground too hard for a colt that does not like to hear his hoofs rattle.

Gamesmaster, who was well backed each way, saved the place bets by finishing third, only a short head behind Robber Chief. All three placed horses are engaged in the Manchester November Handicap, but a 14lb. penalty should put Overall out of court. Robber Chief should also beat Gamesmaster again, as he will be conceding 5lb. less at Castle Irwell than was the case on Saturday.

Hurdler's Success

Mr. A. C. Bostwick, the owner of Mate, had an easy ride on Chenango in the Moderate Plate. Chenango won over hurdles at Newbury at the beginning of the year, and afterwards was successful in the Champion Hurdle Challenge Cup at the National Hunt fixture at Cheltenham. We shall probably see the American over fences during the coming season. Mate, by the way, will be ridden by Joe Childs in the Cambridgeshire.

With meetings at Nottingham, Manchester and Cheltenham followers of the jumping game are well catered for this week. It is customary to find large fields at Nottingham, and there should be no exception to the rule this afternoon. The most valuable event is the Newark Steeplechase, and an excellent chance seems to be held by Brienz.

MORE SURPRISES IN AMATEUR SOCCER

Finchley and Apsley Lose Their Unbeaten Records

The surrender of their unbeaten records by Apsley and Finchley, the heavy defeat of Corinthians, the impressive displays of Leyton, Midland Bank, Walthamstow Avenue and Hastings and St. Leonards in away games, with the remarkable debut of the two Wimbledon reserves, Wright and Lock, provided the big surprises in Saturday's amateur matches.

Introduced into the eleven at the last moment, W. Wright, the reserve centre, and Lock, the reserve inside left, took the chief part in Wimbledon's 4-1 triumph over Wycombe Wanderers, as each scored two goals after Ayres had given the visitors an early lead.

London Caledonians failed to rise to the occasion in the North London Derby with Tufnell Park, whose winning goal was obtained by Viercaut directing a free kick, forty yards out, past the surprised London Caledonians' goalkeeper, Best.

With Taylor scoring nine minutes after the start and Jolliffe giving a great display in goal, the Casuals conquered Clapton and scored their first away victory.

Newell scored the goal which gained Leytonstone's valuable points against St. Albans and strengthened their position at the top of the table.

TO MEET AGAIN

Dulwich Hamlet, in the absence of the majority of their first team players, recalled Levy to the attack against Oxford City, and, with two goals, he only just failed to save them from defeat.

Harwich and Parkeston preserved their unbeaten record by drawing their F.A. Cup tie with Romford, who have to visit Harwich next Wednesday for the replay.

Finchley surrendered their unbeaten record to Enfield because their forwards, in the high wind, could not keep their shols low.

Corinthians' defence collapsed against the shooting of Warfield and Brown in the second half of the game with the R.A.F., whose 6-2 triumph was gained by superior half-back and forward tactics.

The hat trick of Braund, and the clever work of Halcrow, Morrish and Batchelor enabled the Isthmian League to master the Spartan League, whose scorers, Broome, Wvatt and Smith, played well.

FRENCH HORSES AT WORK

The French candidates for the Cambridgeshire, Rentenmark, Eleda and Lilium II, arrived at Newmarket from Folkestone on Saturday, and were exercised on the Heath at Newmarket yesterday morning.

Rentenmark and Eleda cantered six furlongs on the tan on the racecourse side, and Lilium II had a half speed spin of five furlongs across the flat.

The Prix Gladiateur, which closed the Longchamps season yesterday, was won by Prince Olli, the favourite. There were eight starters, and W. Johnstone rode the winner. The distance of the race was three miles seven furlongs.
