THE last meeting of the Newmarket season begins to-day with the prospects of the Rowley Mile being firmer than we have known it for many years. That fact is of great importance, for unless there is a sudden change several horses in the Cambridgeshire will be at a disadvantage with those who have shown that they can act on hard ground. Top weights come into their own in such conditions, because they are the good horses that have little or no preference in such matters.

NEWMARKET, Monday.
The Rutland Handicap is one of the chief events at the opening stage of the Newmarket meeting to-morrow.

Hesitation has not had a race since the early spring. I believe the hard ground has been against her.

Red Horizon, who keeps on winning, is probably the most improved animal in training.

Winsome Prince will run well, as will Misanthrope. However, I shall leave the race to Amoretto, who is nicely weighted, and his public form gives him a splendid chance.

Frank Butters's stable should also win the Criterion Stakes with Shahali. A big danger is Fresh Fox, who receives 12lb., and is expected to give the Aga Khan's colt a good race.

Master Vere, in the Limekiln Stakes, may be another winner for Frank Butters. He has no Umidwar or Campanula to meet on this occasion.

WHY SOCIETY DID NOT RUN

Amateur Rider's Fruitless Journey to Nottingham Steeplechases

Mr. G. P. Shakerley, the well-known amateur rider, met with a disappointment on journeying to Nottingham Steeplechase meeting yesterday, for he went with the intention of riding his horse, Society, in the Newark Chase, but as he had not applied for a permit, was unable to do so.

Mr. Shakerley has ridden ten winners, and when this number has been reached it is necessary to obtain from the stewards of the National Hunt Committee a permit to continue riding as an amateur rider. Consequently, Society's number was withdrawn from the frame.

Mary Tudor "Easy"

Instead of making a spectacular advance in the betting as a result of Donoghue's engagement, Mary Tudor II slipped back to 10 to 1 at yesterday's call-over. There is quite likely to be a different story when the market really settles down, but whether or not there is to be a final furore for Mary Tudor II, it will not shake the hopes behind one or two of the other invaders.

Eleda may not appear to have been allowed sufficient weight to reverse the French form with Mary Tudor II, but she has not come over solely to keep Rentenmark company. Nor is it likely that either would have been sent if their owner shared the view that Mary Tudor II is unbeatable.

Rentenmark made a most favourable impression when fourth to Caymanas at Ascot, and although at first glance he appears rather too near the Hunt Cup winner, it has to be remembered that, as the younger horse, he should have improved by at least 7lb. since June. I still hope we shall find something to keep the prize at home to-morrow, but we have Rentenmark as well as Mary Tudor II to beat.

One of the most interesting races to-day will be the Rutland Handicap, in which Old Burnside is to make what will surely be his final bow at Newmarket, and Red Horizon attempts to defy the handicapper yet once again. Lord Glanely purchased Red Horizon to act as "schoolmaster" to Colombo. Five victories off the reel suggests that he also learnt something during his acquaintance with the crack.

Burnside's Farewell

Amoretto, with a nice pull in the weights, may be a big danger, but I think that one more likely to add to Frank Butters's score is Shahali in the Criterion Stakes. Perryman again rides the Aga Khan's colt, who does not appear to have so much to do as he accomplished at Kempton. As Sevrier will be an absentee Fresh Fox may be the danger.

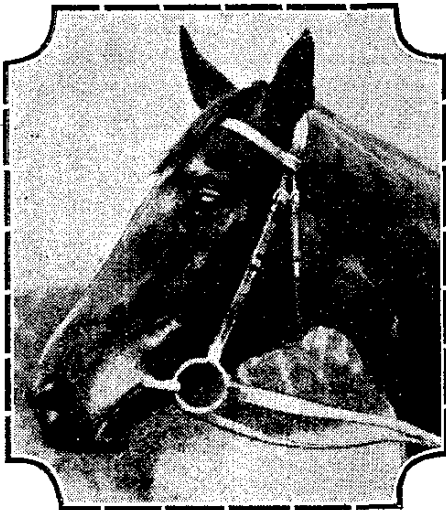

The Old Pretender may set POKER an example by winning the Fordham Welter, but this is really a race best left alone, with The Doge, Shalfeet, Lotus Eater and others "all of a heap" in the handicap.

LO ZINGARO SOLD

Mr. Sol Green, a well-known Australian race-horse owner, has purchased the three-year-old Lo Zingaro for stud purposes. The price, which was not revealed, is stated to be one of the highest ever paid by an Australian for an English horse.

Lo Zingaro, a colt by Colario-Love in Idleness, was owned by Mr. J. A. Dewar and trained by Fred Darling at Beckhampston and entered in several of the big events this year but was only successful on three occasions.

He won the Leigh Memorial Handicap at Lingfield, the Hyperion Stakes at Hurst Park and the Breeders' St. Leger at Derby. He finished third in the St. Leger and was second to Umidwar in the Jockey Club Stakes.

MISHAP TO JOCKEY

DULLER BACK AT EPSOM

George Duller is shortly vacating the training establishment, Blewburton Hall, Aston Tirrold, near Didcot, and he will take over the stabling at Epsom formerly occupied by the late J. M. Bell.

Duller has had a long association with Epsom. He set up as a trainer there in 1930, and went to Aston Tirrold only two years ago.

Duller will be succeeded at Blewburton Hall by L. A. Cundell. The latter at present trains at Chilton, near East Hendred, but the land which adjoins his establishment belongs to the Air Ministry, and is used as an R.A.F. landing ground, and in view of the extension of R.A.F. activities there, the Air Ministry now require the land and stables occupied by L. A. Cundell.
