Wychwood Abbot Now First Fayourite

THERE has surely never been an English handicap of wider international interest than to-day's Cambridgeshire. France, America and tar off Brazil are all directly represented; so to a large extent is the rest of the world with tickets in the Irish Sweep. In all quarters of the globe no racing result has been awaited with such interest since Windsor Lad went out to win the Derby.

To-day, however, there can be no result to equal the jar relt by the Colomboites back in June. The range of weights gives every one of the thirty-seven runners a more or less equal chance. Although the draw for places at the start can have a further big influence, those who have never been to Newmarket may wonder why this should be so on a wide straight course. The answer is the hill at the finish is much more severe on the far side than it is under the stands. A place among the high numbers at the gate is almost fatal.

Draw and Betting

So in effect two chances have to be taken when backing a horse before the numbers go up. One day perhaps we shall have the draw for these events on the eve of the race, though for these events on the eve of the race, though I am not at all sure that such an innovation would be wholly popular. After all, the races that attract most interest are those in which the glorious uncertainty plays the bigger part.

Mary Tudoi II will be a good favourite to-day if she is well drawn. If Donoghue has a high number it is a toss-up what will be favourite. Such is the faith in Caymanas, Wychwood Abbot, Solfatara, Flamenco and Spend a Penny. Any one of these might eventually head the betting if favoured by the draw, and any one of them may win. At the final call-over last night Wychwood Abbot was favourite. favourite.

The Four Best

Summing-up, the four 1 like best are Flamenco, Ca,manas, Wychwood Abbot, and Solfatara. Sorting them out before the draw, Solfatara and Ca,manas go first, because horses of their age usually find a three-year-old to beat them in this particular race. I must say I am joth to part with Caymanas, and there is nothing I like better as one for a place.

Between Wychwood Abbot and Flamenco it is most difficult to choose before the draw. On most lines of form Wychwood Abbot is the best handicapped horse in the race. Against that he has a preference for running his race in his own particular fashion. It is possible for a jockey to humour his mount in small fields, but the doubt is whether Perryman will be able to do so to-day in a race where they are always on the stretch from start to finish ere always on the stretch from start to finish

In the circumstances I am relying on Flamenco in the hope that Harry Wragg is one of the lucky ones in the draw for places. Lord Rosebery's colt fits all the requirements for this particular race. He is in close touch with the representatives of the best classic form of the year, and that is the sort never to be left alone in a Cambridgeshire.


Faith in Flamenco
