L'NTRIES for the Lincolnshire and the Ascot Gold Cup will make to-day's "Racing Calendar" of much more than ordinary interest. Why it should be necessary for nominations to be made at such an early date is not apparent, but at least they will give racing people something else to talk about besides the dismal doings of jumping favourites.

It is known that Felicitation and Windsor Lad will appear among the entries for the Gold Cup, and it will be a big surprise if Brantome is not there as well. This French colt—a superhorse in the estimation of experts across the Channel—is one up on Felicitation so far, but Brantome was "playing at home," so to speak, when they met last season, always a big advantage, which will be on the side of Aga Khan's horse if they meet again.

Rentenmark's Claims

France will also, no doubt, have several entries for the Lincolnshire, and quite possibly another favourite if Rentenmark is among them. This colt paid us two visits last year, and a prominent show in the Cambridgeshire after a fourth—in the Royal Hunt Cup at Ascot—disclosed his Lincoln possibilities.

Several Lincoln Handicaps have already gone to France, and it was a near thing that another did not follow last season. Quartz II came over fitter than most of the home-trained lot, but Play On was one with which he had no advantage, and the dash of Johnny Dines did the rest. Highlander, Badruddin, British Quota and Adriatic are a few that may be found among the entries, which will no doubt include the usual sprinkling of hurdlers.

Latoi Makes Good

Two members of last season's Lincoln field appeared in a new role at Windsor yesterday. They were Ole King Sole and Latoi, of whom the latter was a clever winner from False Point and Crawley Wood. Latoi was trained at Middleham last season, but he is now with P. Thrale, who trained Nitsichin—a full sister to yesterday's winner—for the Cesarewitch.

The Covenanter ran well until False Point warmed up the pace two hurdles from home. He should win a race for Mr. Blair in the near future. Dacoit was another that showed up well; indeed, taken altogether, I doubt if a more promising lot of young hurdlers have appeared in one race this season.

Artful Lacock

PITY THE POOR **MANAGER!**

His Is the Most Precarious Job -Without Luck

There is none for whom I feel more sorry at the moment than Charlie Jones, who has resigned the position of manager of Notts County after little more than three months of experience in such a position.

He must have felt bitter disappointment and disillusion, for no man, on the threshold of a new career, lightly resigns his first position.

The managership of a big professional football club holds out some rich prizes, for the few, but I doubt if there is a more precarious profession,

carious profession.

Is there any other job of importance in which luck plays so big a part? To any man contemplating taking up the position of a football manager I would say, "Are you confident not merely of your qualifications but of your luck? Otherwise, seek something else."

On the whole, the position of manager has attered a good deal of recent years, and for the better, precarious though it still is. There have never been so many managers as at present who are managers in fact as well as in name.

I grant that there are those who will tell you that they have a free hand when that is not literally the truth, but it is a fact that quite a number of managers to-day justify the title.

"ALMOST A CLERK"

Twenty years ago I doubt if there was one. At least such was a rare bird indeed. The directors used to run the club with a certain amount of help from the alleged manager, who, actually, was little better than a clerk. It is not so very long ago that I, knowing something, asked a director of a great First Division club just what was the position of the manager. How did they pick the team?

"That," I was told. "is picked by the whole of the directors.

"The manager is present and is appealed to when we think fit. But he has no vote in the choice of the team, and cannot speak unless he is invited to do so."

"Well." I said, "in my view, you should be relegated next season and be at the bottom of the Second Division the next. If you cannot trust your manager to do a great deal more than that he is of no use. He is not worth the very indifferent salary I know you should sack him. If he be the right.

"You should sack him. If he be the right man, then for goodness sake let him manage."
