**LIKELY HELP AT NEWMARKET**

**Tartan Waits a Year for a Victory**

**BADRUDDIN PLANS**

THE summer racing season can be said to begin in earnest with the first July meeting at Newmarket—which this year again begins in July and not at the tail end of June, as is so often the case. Handicaps, with nice-sized fields of good class, will keep bookmakers and backers busy, but many of us will be more concerned with the doings of the two-year-olds, who have yet to sort themselves out.

It is not often that Ascot comes and goes without leaving some idea as to where we may look for the Derby horses, for the following year. True we had not seen Bahram at this time last year, and in the season before Windsor Lad had not emerged as a classic probable. But at least the two-year-olds of those periods needed less sorting out than the present crop.

**The Aga Khan's Best?**

After two lean years Beckhampton has the promise of better times with Malplaquet and Vanbrugh, but where are the youngsters to carry on where Bahram, Theft and company left off for the Aga Khan? Possibly Mahmoud is the best that has carried the green and chocolate hoops this season. He is twice engaged this week, and if he can again beat Vanbrugh—who was badly drawn at Ascot—or account for Malplaquet, he will have to go pretty high in the list.

Whether Malplaquet or Vanbrugh will prove the pick of the Beckhampton youngsters I would not like to hazard a guess. The latter, as I have said, was a victim of the draw in the New Stakes. Malplaquet was also in a race where the winner drew the favoured stand side. But he was beaten by two useful youngsters in Black Speck and Henry the Fifth, and the former has still to be beaten.

**Badruddin's Race**

Ascot form will be best in several other two-year-old races and also where the older horses are concerned in the Duke of Cambridge Handicap on Wednesday. Badruddin, although on Saturday with this race in view, and as Almond Hill, Wychwood Abbot, Guinea Gap and The Blue Boy are engaged it might well prove a Cambridgeshire rehearsal as well as an Ascot extra.



Scatterdash was not in luck's way when he ran up against Priok in the Hunt Cup. Neither was he a favourite of fortune on Saturday when a bit outpaced by speedier horses to the bend, as he went under by a neck and a head to Tartan and Makila. Humphrey Foster rode a very fine race on Tartan, who had not found the winning post since he scored in the corresponding race—then known as the June Rose Handicap—a year ago.

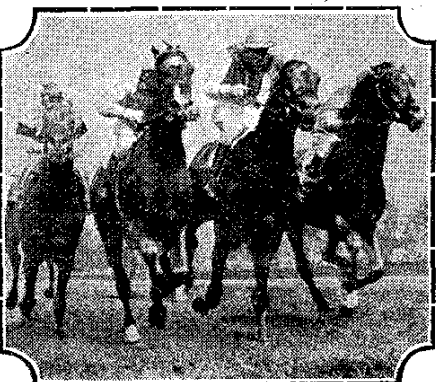
**Two for Fox**

Montrose found the course and the weight all against him, and the other Beckhampton "hope," Charlotte Bronte, did no better in the British Dominion Plate. This nice two-year-old prize went to Major McCalmont, with Grimage, whose battling qualities enabled him to hold off the favourite, Silver Crest, and the improving Carioca.

A five-year-old that had not previously won a race of any sort gave Fox the first half of a double when Bremble took the Wolsey Handicap. His second winner was Feud, a gelding that had shown useful form over hurdles after a successful season on the flat last year.

Wolverhampton's one-day meeting will attract plenty of runners to-day, with Brecknock and Sky Pioneer probably the two most likely to win. The former put up a useful performance in beating Focus at York, and the distance of the Wolverhampton Handicap may suit him better than it will Clematis. Sky Pioneer may find Crayon the one he has to beat in the Dunstall Plate.

During an interval at Sandown Park on Saturday, Paris Choice, a two-year-old filly by Pommern—Adulation, was sold by public auction to Captain C. B. Petre for 75 guineas.

**Steve Misses Big Double by Neck**  
**FRENCH GRAND PRIX WIN FOR BRANTOME'S HALF-SISTER**

Crudite, a half-sister to the crack French racehorse, Brantome, yesterday won the Grand Prix de Paris for his owner, Baron E. de Rothschild, at Longchamp racecourse. G. Bridgland was the successful jockey.

Our own Steve Donoghue was second on William of Valence after having looked a winner at one period of the race.

Prawn Curry, Prince Aly Khan's representative, ridden by C. Smirke, took the field of twenty-two along for the best part of the journey, 1m. 7f. When the straight was reached there were two bunches of horses closely packed together, and it was in one of these that Steve was mixed.

However, he got out of the group by a fine bit of riding, and then made such progress that his mount looked all over a winner.

William of Valence, however, did not quite get the distance, and was passed in practically the last few strides to be beaten by a neck. Princes de Faucigny-Lucinge's Louqsor finished another length and a half behind, third.

**PEARLWEED DISAPPOINTS**

The favourite, Pearlweed, owned by Mr. E. Esmond, was never in the picture.

Baron Rothschild ran two other horses besides Crudite. They were Bokbul and Peniche. Betting on the stable was 27 francs to win and 55 francs for a place. William of Valence paid 7½ francs and Louqsor 33 francs each to a 5 franc stake.

Mr. Sainsbury purchased William of Valence from M. Leon Volterra, who won the prize with Admiral Drake last year, in an effort to win for Great Britain. But Steve, who had steered Admiral Drake to victory so sensationally last year, just failed.

Bernard Carslake rode Samos, which finished fourth, being followed next home by the English One Thousand Guineas winner, Mesa, which also ran third in the Oaks.

Among the notable crowd were two former British Ambassadors to Paris, the Earl of Derby and the Marquis de Crewe.
