OUTSIDERS TO THE FORE

Daytona's Surprise in July Stakes

SOLERINA FAILS

WATCHING the racing—and cheering a royal victory—from the up-to-date and spick-and-span stands on the July course, the average visitor to Newmarket yesterday could come to only one conclusion—that the Jockey Club had succeeded in its ambition to give the public value for money.

The King paid his first visit to a racecourse since the Jubilee celebrations, and what could have been more pleasantly appropriate than Bonnie Dundee's victory in the second race on the new course? Firestone had already won in the royal colours at Brighton, but this was the first time this season that the King had heard the cheering.

All the Way Win

Fox declared 11b. overweight to ride Bonnie Dundee at 7st. 5lb. As events proved, a few pounds more would have made no difference. Racing in the centre of the course, Bonnie Dundee was clear of the others all the way. Dignitary, as at Ascot, failed to stay. Commander III sealed the fate of the Beckhampton colt a long way out without ever promising to catch the King's colt.

The change of luck for the royal stable did not extend to the King's senior jockey. Shouts of "Come on, Joe" greeted Childs when Autumn tackled and got the better of Bright Bird, but Boyd-Rochford's horse could not shake off the lightly-weighted Phoebeus.

Real Outsiders

Phoebeus at 8 to 1 was the outsider of seven runners in a remarkably open betting race. Two of a different sort won the two-year-old races. The first—a selling event—went to a newcomer named La Collina g., the second and much more important July Stakes was also won by a youngster that had not previously seen a racecourse.

The name of this second unknown is Daytona—a suggestion of speed in itself. Sir George Bullough's colt showed more than a suggestion of that excellent quality. Fair Rancee, an easy Ascot winner, could not shake him off in the early stages, and when the hot favourite, Malplaquet, came on the scene Daytona galloped on serenely to win comfortably by a length.

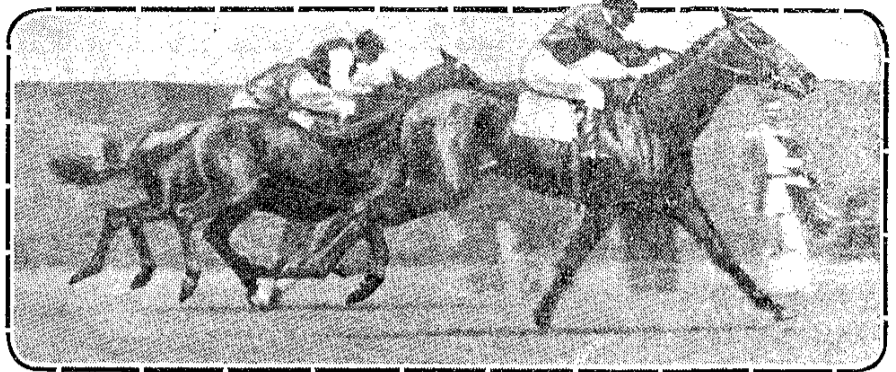
The fact that Daytona was allowed to start at 33 to 1 suggests that he had been hiding his light under a bushel at home. But he won in a style that leaves no doubt about his merit. He might even be the best two-year-old we have seen this season.

The Last Laugh

A favourite did at last get a turn when Mark Time took advantage of the absence of Bellacose in the Foxton Stakes, but the bookmakers breathed—and smiled—again when Fresh Fox upset Solerina in the Barnwell Stakes. Apparently the easier of two races had been chosen for this Lambourn filly; she started at odds-on and lost by a head.

Wychwood Abbot, Badruddin, Buckland and Almond Hill will make to-day's Duke of Cambridge Handicap a second edition of the Royal Hunt Cup. On his favourite course Wychwood Abbot will no doubt improve on his Ascot performance, but this mile should also suit Badruddin and I do not see why he should turn the tables on the Aga Khan's colt.

Sister Anne colt would have been my choice for the Stud Produce Stakes, but apparently he is not a certain starter. That being the case the "dark" Jocanta filly may be good enough. She has a big reputation at Newmarket.

Newmarket's Best for Duke of Cambridge Handicap

NEWMARKET, Tuesday. We shall have three runners in the Duke of Cambridge Handicap to-morrow, and if the race is to be kept at home I feel that Wychwood Abbot is the one most likely to do the trick.

His running at Ascot was not his best form, and I shall ignore it completely, as the going was not in his favour. Leader's four-year-old was put up the Limekilns last week, and I have not seen him go in better style.

Of the other pair, Badruddin is at his best, so must therefore have a good chance. Armour Bright has gone to Carlisle, and on his Newcastle form looks the winner of the Cumberland Handicap.
