Almond Hill Earns Big Race Penalty

AUTUMN WEIGHTS

WHEN Gordon Richards was asked yesterday whether the question of his St. Leger mount had been referred to the Stewards of the Jockey Club, he showed a marked disinclination to discuss the matter.

Readers of these notes will be prepared to learn that Buckleigh is the horse that is holding up the final decision. Apparently, Captain Hogg understood that Richards would be free for Lord Glanely's "mystery horse" if Fair Trial went out and the same idea was held by the connections of Fairbairn.

Big Race Horses Win

A royal victory for Marconi after a great struggle with Trio, and successes for two horses whose names are prominent in connection with the big Newmarket autumn double were the chief features at Derby yesterday.

Almond Hill, on the other hand, earned a 5lb. penalty for the Cambridgeshire by her success in the Feveril of the Peak Plate, and must now give British Quota 16lb. at Newmarket compared with 9lb. that separated them yesterday.

It was hoped that Nunnery would complete a double for the King by winning the Devonshire Nursery, but the filly flattered only to deceive. When half the distance had been covered Nunnery deprived the early leader, Roberta, of the lead, but she failed to hold the Manton filly, Chief Guide, and in the end was deprived of second place by Roberta, who was kept going by Richards to the bitter end.

Stable with Stayers

The weights for the Cesarewitch give a vivid idea of the strength of Captain Boyd Rochfort's stayers. This trainer, who has won the race two years running with Enfield and Seminole is responsible for the first three in the handicap—Enfield, Black Devil and Alcazar—and following Primero is another from the same stable in Autumn. Already Sirett has been fixed up to ride for the stable both here and in the Cambridgeshire, but that is probably as far as the plans have gone to date.

If Enfield was almost certain of top weight in the long-distance race it was a foregone conclusion that Wychwood Abbot, who won the Cambridgeshire in such great style last year, would head the list in the second half of the double. From 8st. 6lb. to 9st. 7lb. is not such a big rise as Enfield has been given—he has gone up 25lb.—and it will not surprise me in the least to see him again in the thick of the fight.

Manchester promises the best racing of the week at the meeting which begins to-day. Miss Pick, who forfeited a tempting engagement last week for the Palatine Nursery, may be the best thing of the day, and another two-year-old that looks a highly probable winner is Pay Up in the Foal Plate.
