is there as the sole hope of the stable that has won the last two Cesarewitches with Seminole and Enfield, and the only chance I see of him losing his position as favourite is a spectacular performance by Tommaok when that Newbury Cup casualty does his final gallop. \* \* \* At the moment 18 to 1 is the price on offer about Tommaok, but I am quite prepared to see him a sound second favourite, even if he does not pass Woodstock, should his final spin prove satisfactory. Tommaok is still one of the worst horses in the books of those layers who began business early on the race, and his name is linked with nice doubles about very "live" Cambridgeshire horses.

#### Barra Sahib Again

Rain and mist spoilt the enjoyment of some good racing at York yesterday; indeed, on such a day a seven-race card seemed all too long. But for once in a way those who subscribed most heartily to that idea were the bookmakers, who, after starting fairiy well, "paid out" on three good favourites and two well-backed winners in Listoi and Diosma \* \* \*

Barra Sahib made a lot more friends by an-other stylish victory, even although it was only by half a length that he beat the Gimcrack winner, Paul Beg. So far as could be seen, Barra Sahib was in front from start to finish, and it is probable that Smirke could have in-creased the winning margin had it been necessary.

#### First This Time

Another fine victory was that gained by Volcanius in the Chesterfield Handicap. A year ago this Lambourn horse could only finish second under 7st. 9lb. Now he carried the welter of 9st. 6lb. and proved much too good for Liberty End, who was receiving 25lb. The latter was not so well fancied as her stable companion, Auld Reekie, who, as at Ayr. let the stable down hadly.

\* \* \* Peacock also had two runners in the Rock-ingham Handicap, and this time he had the winner. Both Moneybox and Listoi were on the 8 to 1 mark, but whereas Moneybox made little show the other was all too good for Lit-gation and a dozen others. Old Pickle could just be discerned with the leaders at the final turn, and like Disarmament, was much nearer the front than either of the two favourites, Cyrus and Winastep at the finish.

#### At York To-day

A big entry for the Little Go Plate to-day contains the names of several prominent Cambridgeshire candidates, but apparently most of them will be conspicuous by their absence when the numbers go up. Finalist, under orders for Haydock Park on Saturday, is a certain non-runner, Badruddin gives way to Maltravers, and Gunboat s not likely to run.
