Coughing and hard ground, of course, were the cause, and, as one trainer put it, we shall not know where we stand for the rest of the season. Wittol won the Nursery for Lord Rosebery and won it all the way. Charley's Aunt, expected to add to Captain Hogg's successes in the race, was a sufferer at the start, and the well-handicapped Cato dropped out after six furiongs.
