WHITE ANT WINS.

Sequence of Outsiders at Prices from Tens to Twenties.

There was some remarkable racing at the final stage of the Derby meeting. Three of the events on the card fell to women owners, and outsiders won throughout the afternoon.

AUTUMN HANDICAPS.

Remarkable Success of Outsiders at Derby's Final Stage.

The weights for the Cesarewitch and Cambridgeshire came to hand yesterday. The acceptances will be published next week, and only a glance of Mr. Dawkins' work is necessary at this stage.

Kireubbin heads the Cesarewitch with 9st. 5lb., and here I may state that he is very much fancied for the big race in Spain on Sunday.

A likely candidate is sure to spring from Alec Taylor's lot. Air Balloon has 9st. 1lb., Juniso 8st. 1lb., Manton 7st. 9lb., East Tor 6st. 11lb., Galaciella 6st. 8lb. and Tomatin 6st. 2lb.

DERBY INCIDENTS.

Women owners were very much to the fore at Derby yesterday. Miss Keyser won the opening race with Wellwisher, Mrs. A. Bendir secured the Elvaston Nursery with Skias, and last, but not least, Mrs. Arthur James carried off the Peveril of the Peak Plate with White Ant.

But women did not have matters all their own way. Outsider after outsider came up, and the bookmakers were on good terms with themselves all the afternoon. We had one winner at 20 to 1, two at 100 to 8, and the other three at 10 to 1.

Several horses with Cambridgeshire liabilities were saddled for the Peveril of the Peak Plate. One of them in Poisoned Arrow obtained a place. He, however, was beaten a length by White Ant.

A notable absentee was Aclare, and Isle of Wight settled down favourite from Humpty Dumpty and Evander.

The race itself needs little description. Smirke took White Ant to the front from the outset and was not seriously troubled to dispose of the attentions of Poisoned Arrow. Paulinus was third four lengths away and Evander headed the "also ran."

Mathieson, to the fourth round; the defeat of Guy Lintott, last year's runner-up in the third stage, and the exit of the French boy, P. Maneuvrier.

Mathieson's victories were scored over W. Lewis, whom he beat by 6 and 4, and P. Wilson, who was defeated by 4 and 3.

In the second round Maneuvrier's defeat came after an excellent opening by the French boy against T. H. South, who was three down with that number of holes played.

In the other games Jesse Sweetser (Siwanoy) defeated Jesse Guilford (Woodland), the holder, by 4 and 3, and Charles (Chic) Evans was four up on Goodchaux. R. T. (Bobby) Jones (Atlanta) and W. F. McPhail (Norfolk) were square at the end of the first round.

In the second round Tolley defeated G. F. Aulbach, of Scarborough (U.S.A.), by 3 and 3, and was the only British competitor to enter the third round.
