

LORD LONSDALE'S 33 TO 1 ST. LEGER WINNER.

Royal Lancer's Success in Second Colours. RAMUS UNLUCKY.

French Crack Badly Left at the Start.

A huge crowd saw Princess Mary's host, Lord Lonsdale, win the St. Leger yesterday with the outsider, Royal Lancer. It was a popular victory, despite the fact that few people can have supported the winner. Other features of the day's sport were:

Racing.—The acceptances for the autumn handicaps were announced yesterday. There were forty-four withdrawals from the Cesarewitch and thirty-nine from the Cambridgeshire.

Cricket.—The match between the M.C.C. touring eleven and C. I. Thornton's team at Scarborough was washed out by rain, not a ball being bowled.

ROYAL LANCER'S ST. LEGER.

Ramus Passes Many of His Opponents in a Hopeless Chase.

Lord Lonsdale, a Doncaster Steward and one of the most famous figures on the turf, won his first classic triumph yesterday, when Royal Lancer, ridden by the apprentice R. Jones, gained a runaway victory in the queerest St. Leger for many years.

That the French horse, Ramus, would have won with an equal start most onlookers will agree. Loth to leave the paddock until an at-

tendant gave him hefty persuasion, he stood absolutely still when the gate went up, and must have lost 200 yards from the leaders when Garner persuaded him to start.

It looked, and proved, a hopeless chase when he did descend to move, but such was his pace that he was in the middle of a strung-out field as they made the turn. Nor did his effort end there, for running on stoutly he passed all save the placed horses, his fellow-invaser, Gaurisankar, Harpenden and Sanhedrim.

HOW ROYAL LANCER WON.

Fred Power, one of the smallest horses in the field, ran well for a mile and a quarter, and died out with Werwolf and Argo, who had both figured conspicuously to this point. Then Ceylone took the lead with Royal Lancer, Sanhedrim, Silurian and several others in a bunch. Round the bend I thought Sanhedrim took a momentary lead, but he was quickly done with, and Royal Lancer, going to the front soon after, was never again seriously challenged.

Royal Lancer carried the second colours, as the stable had much greater hopes of Lord Lonsdale's other candidate, Diligence, and choosing between the pair Fred Lane rode the latter, and to rub in the bad luck he finished practically last.

Silurian ran a splendid race, and there are more unlikely things than that he will develop into a top-class cup horse. Ceylone, like the winner, an admitted "second string," beat his stable companion, pointlessly, and Prestongrange and Villars were "missing" from start to finish.

Royal Lancer took seven seconds longer than Polemarch occupied to cover the distance a year ago, but this is partly accounted for by the sticky going. A dull unsettled morning kept the crowd down to the smallest I have seen at Doncaster for many years.

A drizzling rain was falling and the light was very bad when Silver Zep began the big day by running away with the Cleveland Handicap. Moreover, he was backed to do it, and the money for Willie Waugh's horse caused Cortona to ease appreciably.

MY BIRD'S VICTORY.

Long Corrie was well backed in the Melton Plate, but found the ground a little too yielding. In any case, I am afraid that Long Corrie has deteriorated sadly.

Gally Strickland on the rails side was always prominent, but he could not overhaul My Bird, on whom young Feltham rode a most confident finish. Glensakaki, another light of other days, finished third without ever threatening real danger to the other pair.

We had a reminder of Caligula's St. Leger when Parth carried the same colours in the Tattersall Sale Stakes and upset a screaming favourite in Twelve Pointer. Legend also finished in front of the Duke of Westminster's colt, and did so on his merits.

Jarvie, in spite of a 7lb. penalty, made a procession of the Bradgate Park Nursery. A lot of money came for the Gatwick winner, Valini, and she justified it to an extent by getting second.
