

Briton raided Nazis to arm 'escape ships'

SAFELY back in England now is the man largely responsible for the dash of 10 Norwegian ships from Sweden — Bryan Reynolds, aged 32, Gloucester-born ex-manager of racing stables.

For the last two years he has been in Finland and Sweden. Captain Nichols and Captain Kershaw, captains of two of the Norwegian ships which returned to Gothenburg, admitted they obtained guns from Reynolds. And behind this confession is the story of 10 months' secret work. More than once Reynolds crossed the snow-covered mountains from Sweden into Norway alone.

ANOTHER MORRISON STORM

Mr. Davidson is to ask the Prime Minister whether this truly reflects the policy of the Government. He said to me last night: "How can this encourage our Allies, thousands of whose people have been tortured — and how can it encourage our own people who are making such heavy sacrifices?"

MAJOR GERALD WILKINSON, British Liaison Officer with General MacArthur, describing himself "Just a Limey (Englishman) on a romantic errand," told me in the only interview he has yet given that the United Nations are fortunate to have such men in such vital theatres as MacArthur and Wavell.
