

BACKED TO WIN £20,000

NORTHERN STABLES RISK BIG MONEY AT ASCOT

NORTHERN stables hope to make a stir at Ascot: Bolton mare, Sally Andrews, was backed to win over £20,000 at yesterday's call-over in London.

It was the sensation of the Victoria Club. Early birds got 25 to 1, but down the price came tumbling until a wager of £1,000 to £75 was recorded.

Carr has never won a race at Ascot; he hopes to secure two or three handicaps by the time his Manchester winner, The Drummer, has run in Friday's Wokingham Stakes.

Sally Andrews is a five-year-old Legger and ran well at Chester. Now with 7st. 8lbs. She dodded a sprint with the Yorkshire winner, Silversol, to carry 15bs. more. She might not give her to Sir Abi Bailey's Foxfield—a maiden who ran well against Pre-potential at Kempton.

Three of the best-backed Hunt Cup horses are trained in the north. Elsey's bold "Jubilee" winner, Commander III, is joint favourite with "Sally" at 13 to 1—Cowie's Squadron Castle was backed to win £20,000 at 20s. The King's Fairley and Noble Turf are also sound at that price: Couvert down from

18s. to 100 to 6. I know that a fourth northerner, Harry Peacock's Lincoln winner, Marmaduke Jinks, is thought to be better now and fancied. Incognito is still very doubtful, and Hypothesis and Pike Barn have been scratched.

No more yet for Midsirem, but he was not the only "possible" without a quotation yesterday. Go slow, however, until you know his chosen race.

Upsets

I EXPECT there will be mixed doubles on Sandspire (Prince of Wales's Stakes), Mirza II. (Coventry) and Fearless Fox (Gold Vase). But Fearless Fox was a 2 to 1 chance when Rondo beat him a length and a half last June, and another 20 to 1 shot in Valerian turned up to upset Sind in the corresponding event to that in which Sandspire should make his maiden pull tell. I like Valerian and evergreen Guisard best of the high-weighters, and also note Hors bord—who may beat Thoth this time—Theedwirdorth, Carioca—who will be accompanied by Miss Windsor—the King's Fairlead, Fet, Cornered, Jonker, and the plating Mrs. Grundy.

I am most interested, however, in Rondo, Valerian—who should have won well twice. Aghincourt will clash with the Manchester Cup—Farsi and Kep-Oron.

Rondo's owner loves a long-priced winner, and Rondo may recover his form on a course where—like Valerian—his only success has been gained. Bel Aethel, too, ran well there last year.

This is Different

MIRZA II. impressed all who saw his Newmarket debut, as a winner also at Ascot. Opposition will, of course, be very different now, for Darti Tolly has won well twice. Aghincourt will clash with Portmarnock in the New Stakes. Berwick will improve upon his first show, and I mentioned yesterday that Lord Derby's newcomer Onslaught had been well galloped. So has The Wain.

All-conquering Persie will run three fillies—Skinthos may be best in the Queen Mary Stakes, but should not beat the Epsom winner Prosecutor, and also Jack Jarvis's leading Sandown pair, Sweet Corn and Saintly. Kelpie, Laughing Water and Chrissie also represent winning form, and the "dark" Lapel and Serafina—said to be better than Prosecutor—can go. Well Taken and Madrina are progressing, but I liked Sweet Corn's very strong finish when landing a long shot.

No Derby winner this time in the St. James's Palace Stakes, but a clash between Goya II., Le Grand Duc, Cash Book, Full Sail, and the less-willing Fairford over the Old Mile. Apart from Cash Book, this may be their best distance, and the Manton colt was all at sea down the Epsom hill. Full Sail was also in trouble.

Le Grand Duc outlasted Goya II., and finished third, but he may not do so now. Softer ground will also suit Cash Book, but it might be too neat.

Santanya crops up again, and, like Le Cambino (who was so prominent in the Derby), he can tackle the older Daysont, Pampas Grass and Tempest II. over the Hunt Cup course in the Queen Anne Stakes, in which the French mare Musson and the non-staying Fieldfare have all the advantages.

I assume Tempest II. will run. He has not been shaping well at Newmarket, but is 10bs. better in with Pampas Grass compared with the Hunt Cup, in which Elsey is content to rely solely upon Commander III.
