

# Sir Abe Bailey has first win of the season

EPSOM, Thursday.

He finished a modest fourth to the unconsidered Chatsworth, Malabar and the overhauled True Mate in the Blue Riband Trial Stakes.

This new race did not live up to its bold title, but was certainly a "trial" for punters who noted that nothing seemed going right for Olympus from the jump off.

He was not near the front this time but only fourth of five with True Mate leading, and I could see, that Strett was in danger of getting hemmed in, and when they turned into the straight it took him some time to extricate Olympus.
