

Mirza II. may beat a stable companion

NEWMARKET, Tuesday.

THE rapid recovery of Tahir doubles the Aga Khan's hopes and considerably increases interest in tomorrow's Two Thousand Guineas.

I want to make it clear that Tahir's slight lameness was merely a mischance.

He is perfectly sound otherwise and Frank Butlers made sure by working Smirk's mount this morning.

Khan Bahadur will not also run, but he may be a better hope. No doubt Tahir is regarded in the formidable stable as the Aga Khan's main hope and a most likely winner.

Whether or not I choose Portmarnock, Tahir or Pasch for the Derby purposes in five weeks' time, for the first classic tomorrow I shall rely on the Aga Khan's brilliant

MIRZA II.

Some only consider him as the "second string," but he won Newbury's Greenham and has been fully keyed up for this test over the Rowley Mile.

When Harry Wragg was given a big returner, owner and trainer dared not

"Waiting" may pay

I THINK Wragg will endeavour to do the overhauling. Though waiting tactics did not pay when Portmarnock beat "Mirzy" at Doncaster, I thought the loser was never on the right leg on that occasion.

When opposite methods were employed later at Newmarket he stopped to a walk, then ran out and was caught by Scottish Union.

His conquerors have not had a race this season. Scottish Union's gallop showed him to be well forward and I know he is strongly fancied, but I gather at Newmarket that Boyd-Rochfort has not hurried Portmarnock at all.

This good colt is Derby favourite. That is the goal, for they do not think the extra half mile at Epsom will be far.

I have not heard definitely whether Glen Loam runs, for he needs softer ground, but the Kempton failure Unbreakable will accompany Portmarnock in different ownership.

IT seems remarkable that Unbreakable was a better favourite to give newton than Almy River (Roxton) fair chance.
