

Derby 'darkie' Pasch bounds into fame

NEWMARKET, Wednesday.

A MONTH ago few outside Fred Darling's stable knew even the name of the "dark" Pasch.

Today Pasch, starting a 5 to 2 favourite, won the Two Thousand Guineas in classic champion style.

Those inspired punters who got on him early for the Derby at 33-1 or more can now hedge for an assured profit over the new Epsom favourite.

There is quite the old-fashioned Beckhampton stable ring about all this.

Pasch was not produced as a youngster; was sent to Newmarket in Craven Week without running and later made his victorious debut at Kempton when he had more than a stone pull with the three-year-olds.

The "darkie" has, however, been left to the last few days. Many have gone for a great coup. I should not like the layers' books!

Another double?

OUT in Shanghai, Mr. Hugh Morris waited to hear from his racing expert wife how Pasch had fared.

He will now hurry home, hoping to see his colt emulate the double of Mirza II, who won the 1925 Guineas and Derby in his colours.

And Gordon Richards has managed at last to win the Two Thousand. Will he also ride his first Derby winner?

day to be coaxed by the champion into the usual unsatisfactory enclosure.

Pasch had also gone to the post wanting to "tear up the earth" whereas sprinting Mirza II was as sober as a Gold Cup stayer.

Gordon explained to me how he had given Pasch one "easy" after jumping off and leading for over a quarter of a mile.

Then he let the modest Scaraben and Gaecropic, who lasted much longer, lead him for a spell.

Once he let the winner have rein again, however, away he sailed, and our binoculars were turned on to his seventeen vain pursuers until the post was reached.

The verdict over Scottish Union was two lengths.

A grand Newmarket day—and a fine race, with most of the leading young stars of 1937 confirming merit, but meeting their master in the dazzling product of 1938.
