

"Ann" may prove best of Butters's 5

NEWMARKET, Thursday. FIRST "One Thousand" problem is to try to find the best of Frank Butters's full-hand tomorrow.

The Aga Khan has La-Li as well as my mai nhope, Ann of Austria, each of the other three being separately owned.

Many regarded Prince Aly's Stafaralla as the pick, but I know he fears his father's fast filly.

Juvenile form of Miss Paget's Radiant also bears close inspection.

Sir Alfred Butt's Solar Flower made a successful debut at the last meeting, but I doubt if she can emulate Pasch in her second venture.

Gordon rides Radiant, who was first and a little behind Stafaralla in Pasch's race at Kempton. She is, however, greatly fancied to complete Richards's double.

I took a chance on Mirza II, just tipping out the Rowley mile. It was second to Carisle last year.

Pasch's breastplate slipped up in the Newbury Cup and seemed likely to choke him so suddenly he fell back last. He was obviously fancied then. Another obvious danger is Rime Tout, who was second to Carisle last.

Lorey was apparently kicked by Miss when they came down at the first turn in the first race today, but I was glad to hear later that an arm had been broken. He is taken to hospital for treatment and hardly seemed aware himself how the mishap occurred.

Another sequel to the race was the claiming by Miss Paget of the narrowly beaten Prince Achille—a recent hurdle winner but not over generous.

Another Liverpool winner in Antecedent also advertised the value of current form. Streamson is still a maiden and did not run enthusiastically.
