

# Twenty-four horses left in Epsom classic

**L**EADING stables had prepared us for an uneventful Derby final acceptance.

Twenty-four runners would be largest Epsom classic field for five years, but one or two outsiders may drop out before next Wednesday's race.

Jack Jarvis is content with the staying Flylon, but Cottrell has left in Caerloptic—who led Pasch once in the Two Thousand—as well as Sir Abe Bailey's main hope—Golden Sovereign.

The withdrawal of the same owner's Ramtapa was anticipated, his Manton trainer, Lawson, being content with Lord Astor's Pound Foolish and Cave Man, but as I have mentioned before, Cave Man's running will depend on the state of the Epsom track.

Golden Sovereign stock did not altogether fail in a full mile and half gallop yesterday at Newmarket.

"Mirza" went better again, but both seemed to have had enough of it, and Dickens, on Dardanelles II, actually finished in front of the Derby pair.

Frank Buttens probably turned on the pace a bit. I know he had not overtaxed the stamina of Mirza II in previous work over the full distance, for the race must be left more to Wrags's use of Epsom opposition.

The trainer said as "big visions" this year I've a sneaking fancy still for Mirza II's brilliance and doubt if Wrags made a mistake when he declined an offer to ride Mr. Rank's well-fancied Scottish Union.

Caralake will doubtless disagree. The veteran "Brownie" wants a Derby to crown a great career.

## Northern challenger

**T**HIS King has left in the moderately progressive Licence. If Lickee runs, Crouch would ride and another rider, probably Hartigan, be on Malabar. Such as Carr's new charge Seventh Wonder who ran well at Ascot and Earl's Court, the handicapped Silv. On may be in the field, but the anticipated renewal of True Mate has been made, so Seventh Wonder will be the only northern challenger.

It would have been different if Paclouz had been engaged.

Boyd-Rochfort would naturally fancy Bensley's mount Portmarnock more if there was a lot of rain. Strett is retained as the stable light-weight, but heavier men may be found for the big American colt Valerian III—who may be ridden by the well-seasoned Joe Taylor—and the booted Unbreakable who was Strett's mount in the first classic.

Unbreakable was then in some scrum with Mirza II, but may not be a true slayer.

## Gordon at Windsor?

**A**LL the leading winter fancies hold their ground, but Pasch, despite weakening in price has revolutionised the market since he first came into the wingers at 33 to 1.

Gordon Richards will naturally not let a broken toe on his left foot interfere with plans; Pasch's pilot may never again have such a ready-made opportunity to ride his first Derby winner.

He hopes to resume at Windsor on Saturday.

Boyd-Rochfort (presuming he runs them all) and Fred Darling are the only trainers to have three runners. It is unusual for the stable which houses the favourite, but Darling's other charges, Bois Roussel and Trouton, are also, of course, in different ownership.

## Newmarket gallop

**T**HE Agh Khan believes in multiple representation as a rule. Now he is content with Mirza II and Tahir.

This enables the chief retained jockey, Strike, to have a mount, and he was up on Tahir against another successful Derby rider in Harry Wragg.
