## Mistake Causes Windsor Scene

A MISTAKE in the hoisting of the number of the last winner led to a remarkable scene at Windsor on Saturday. Zaimis, ridden by Steve Donoghue, was first signalled as the winner. Backers did not agree, and notified the fact with loud booms. Bookmakers, delighted that Harvest Moon—a Gordon Richards favourite—had been beaten, cheered delightedly. With little delay the judge had the numbers altered. It was now the backers' turn to cheer. They did. Not to be left out the bookies boomed—but they paid out. Harvest Moon was Richards's second winner of the afternoon. After twenty-five consecutive losers he hit the mark on Drawing Paper.

If you ever think of "doubling up" on jockey's mounts make a note of this: starting with a shilling, the amount to go on Drawing Paper as the twenty-sixth stake would have been £1,677,721. J. Lawson's Ascot luck continued when Rippon Tor finished like a lion to beat Merriccroft in the Robert Wilmot Handicap.

By BOUVERIE JUST a bit too cool to think of the river on Ascot Sunday, so instead I kept company with the form book looking again over a memorable four days with an eye to the future. The winners are there for all to see. Mirza II, the flyer, Ramtapa, the two-year-old that may improve more than any other youngster that won last week, and Rhodes Scholar, seemingly "booked" with ordinary luck for another Eclipse victory. My search was chiefly among the failures, and I feel on pretty safe ground in choosing the following dozen as likely winners soon:—

- BERWICK SERELIA WELTAKEN LOHENGRIIN AGINCOURT SWEET CORN
- HARINA FINALIST GRANDJO CONSTELLATE SIE CALIDORE VEUVE CLICQUOT.

The first six are two-year-olds and half of them were already winners before they went to Ascot. The "maidens" are Berwick, Serelia and Weltaken, and it is on the cards that the latter pair will win this week.

### Handicap Horses

The second half dozen will be mainly concerned with handicaps; Grandjo and Constellate in sprints; Finalist and Harina at middle-distances, and Sir Calidore in events for stayers.

Constellate, Harina and Sir Calidore are all engaged this week, and the latter's bold effort in the Ascot Stakes will make him a popular choice for the Northumberland Plate on Wednesday.

A year ago Coup de Roi was an easy winner after running no better than did Sir Calidore at Ascot, and the Stakes form was also good enough when Doreen Jane won. Newtown Ford, who dead-heated for second place with Plunger twelve months ago, Weathervane, Queen's Shilling, Mrs. Grundy and the rest are going to make a great day at Gosforth Park on Wednesday.

### FROM THE STABLES

Newmarket, Sunday. Although our runners will not be strong in numbers at the opening stage of the Folkestone meeting, headquarters will be represented in each of the six events with a fancied runner or two. Harvey Leader may score a double with Flick and Handley, and Major Beatty will have fancied runners in Jubilee II and Spartan III.
