Calder Does It Again

IF there is anything like a royal road to success in racing it is surely following Jack Jarvis's horses at Sandown—and particularly Calder. Three winners came from the stable on Saturday—all ridden by E. Smith. One of them was Calder, who has now scored four times on the course and has never found the winning post on any other track. Mirano, who completed the hat trick, also carried Lord Rosebery's colours. Jeannetta, who began the sequence, was owned by Jack Jarvis's daughter. Now this smart plater belongs to Mr. J. Ismay, who bought her for 760 guineas. Brother Basil hoped for a share of the Jarvis luck with Pegasus and Buckwood. All he got was two seconds, with both easily beaten. Holyrood, who upset Pegasus without much ado, is another of the "horses for courses" type, since he won the corresponding race twelve months ago. And to rub in this theory Pegomas came up for the second year in succession in the Old Newton Cup at Haydock. Originally it was intended that Merely a Minor should represent Carr's stable, and it was only because he met with a slight mishap that Pegomas was substituted. Since Carr bought this French-bred colt from Prince Aly Khan he has won nine races and more than £4,000 in stakes.

By BOUVERIE TWO important races were decided abroad yesterday, the Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp and the German Derby. English sportsmen were interested in the Longchamp affair. Cold Scent, joint favourite with Mid-Day Sun for the St. Leger, was well fancied to add another triumph to Sir Abe Bailey's long string of racing successes, and Tommy Weston went over to ride. But Cold Scent was not good enough, and was unplaced to Clairvoyant. A fortnight ago Clairvoyant was an easy winner of the French Derby at Chantilly. He is considered by many people to be the best three-year-old in Europe, and was now heavily backed. French sportsmen anticipated danger to their champion from the Italian crack, Donatello II, a son of Bienheim. He was beaten by three parts of a length, and third honours went to Gonfalonier. Marcel Semblat was the successful jockey, and it was his first victory in the Grand Prix.

Sultan Mahomed Fourth

Sultan Mahomed, also engaged in the Doncaster classic, was ridden by C. Smirke. He did the best of the others to finish fourth. The President of the Republic watched the race and there was the biggest crowd that has ever gathered at Longchamp since the race was inaugurated. Further afield, the Graditz Stud won the German Derby with Abendfrieden. The 250,000 spectators included General Goering. The first of the two most enjoyable meetings on the July course begins at Newmarket tomorrow, following a one-day fixture at Wolverhampton to-day. The bits of the week will be the meeting of Mirza II and Ramtapa in the July Stakes and Valerian's attempt to win another big prize for Sir Abe Bailey when he opposes Fearless Fox in the Princess of Wales's Stakes. Best thing at Wolverhampton to-day should be Bonnie Scotland, who was left in the Dunstable Plate to the exclusion of two other Beckhampton youngsters. Beat all except Caerlotic at Epsom, and before that was placed in each of his two previous races.
