## TRAINER'S DOUBLE 100 MILES APART

THE King's pair, Felstone and Sanctorum, were not the only Newmarket-trained favourites to fail at Edinburgh. Their fate was shared by Swoop and Dancing Comet. They are still showing they can train horses in the north.

Another "Gordon day" at Chepstow three winners and another beaten by only a neck. Babel may have been lucky to beat Eddy, but then isn't Chepstow Richards's lucky course?

V. Smyth, like F. Butters and G. Armstrong, scored a training double with the difference that Ruby Red (at Chepstow) and Desert Night (Lingfield) scored their victories over 100 miles apart.

Favourites would have gone "through the card" at Lingfield if First Cast had not just held off Rockies in the Imberhorne Handicap.

Terror, Lady of Shalott, Paul Beg and Fair-play are latest scratchings from the Stewards' Cup.

Three horses were sold at Lingfield on Saturday for 65 guineas. Molly Macree made 45 guineas and Cornflower and Luxury Liner £10 each.

Major R. Glover, a newcomer to racing, has become a patron of J. Dines's stable at Epsom. He has taken a half-share with Mrs. Dines in Artist's Prince, and has purchased the two-year-olds, Hazel and Headley Lass.

MOST pleasing result in Saturday's racing was the success of Radiant in the Great Foal Plate at Lingfield Park—pleasing because it would seem that Miss Dorothy Paget has at last made a good bargain after many disappointments with high-priced yearlings.

Radiant was one of two relatives to famous horses sold last year. She is a full sister to Windsor Lad, and Miss Paget bought her for 11,500 guineas at the Newmarket July sales.

Later, Orwell's half-brother, the still unnamed Golden Hair colt, came into the market at Doncaster. For this one Miss Paget gave 15,000 guineas, the record price for a yearling sold at public auction.

### Fine Two-Year-Olds

The pair became stable companions of Mirza II, whose trainer, Frank Butters, has surely never had such a wealth of two-year-old talent as he has this season.

Mirza II runs again at Newmarket this week. On Saturday Butters has the Golden Hair colt, Radiant, for West

and the Ascot winner, Tahir, engaged in the richest two-year-old race of the season at Sandown. And still to come is Khan Bahadur, a brother to the Derby winner Mahmoud.

Radiant may not have had a lot to beat on Saturday, but she did her job in the style of a good 'un in keeping with her good looks and delightful action.

Radiant has been entered for next year's Derby, as well as the One Thousand Guineas, Oaks and St. Leger.

The reappearance of Mirza II and an instructive Stewards' Cup trial are the chief attractions at Newmarket this week, but the race is the Eclipse Stakes at Sandown on Friday.

Rhodes Scholar, a runaway winner twelve months ago, will be favourite to complete the double, and the prospects are that he will emulate Buchan, who scored for Lord Astor in 1919 and 1920.

His Grace, second twelve months ago, will again be in the field. Another interesting competitor will be Fair Copy, but whereas His Grace has shown himself to be a much improved horse this season, Lord Derby's colt has not touched anything like the brilliance of his two-year-old days.

More for Richards?

Bigger fields than usual are promised at Chepstow to-day, but they should not prevent Gordon Richards again being among the winners, as he always is on this course.

Ascot form suggests a winner in Hornpipe, who represents Manton in preference to the disappointing Irresistible in the Summer Stakes.

Respondentia and Grand Pet colt are other promising mounts for Richards, but the former might not beat Reviresco, who was in front of Hornpipe when second to Azam Pasha in a big field at Ascot.
