SANDOWN'S BIG DOUBLE

"GIVE me luck before form or information," I heard a man remark as he went to draw his winnings on Portmarnock at Sandown on Saturday. He was right. You can't beat it.

Nothing went right for Captain Boyd-Rochfort and his jockey Pat Beasley early in the season. Now nothing is going wrong.

Victories in two of the richest races of the season in successive days have surely wiped out those disappointments with Perifox and Omaha. And there is still the Leger to come!

Portmarnock has always had the reputation of being the best two-year-old in the stable. An Ascot failure, however, left the idea that Sir Humphrey de Trafford's colt might have been overrated, so 10 to 1 was the price to follow Boswell's twenties. Nice odds for the Double—230 to 1.

Miss Dorothy Paget's £15,750 Golden Hair colt has evidently picked up a pointer from his gallop with Mirza II. He beat everything from the gate and kept his lead until Portmarnock caught him a furlong from home. Tahir eventually beat him for second place, but he was a long way in front of the Aga Khan's other runner Far West who gave a most disappointing performance.

Magnet's Cup

That other rich prize the Anniversary Cup was won equally comfortably by Magnet, whose success recalled his fine effort against William of Valence in the Rosebery Stakes at Kempton. El Sbaa—who like the winner came on the outside—beat the others easily enough, so perhaps his turn will come in the Liverpool Cup on Friday.

With a full week in Scotland and meetings at Leicester, Bath, Hurst Park and Worcester, no fewer than 96 races will be decided this week. Over 2,000 horses are engaged, many of them in two and three races.

Best thing at Leicester to-day may be Scotia's Glen. An Ascot winner, she may again be seen to advantage in the Workshop Manor Plate.

Reconsider, as the Think Twice filly, was little more than a stone behind Mid-Day Sun in their two-year-old days. With 7st. 4lb. she must have a big chance in the Prince of Wales's Handicap.

KING'S GAP TESTED

King's Gap, a candidate for the Stewards' Cup to be run at Goodwood to-morrow week, was tried at Newmarket yesterday. Ridden by W. Wells, he won easily over five furlongs. Safariland was second, Cleora third, and Prince Hal fourth.

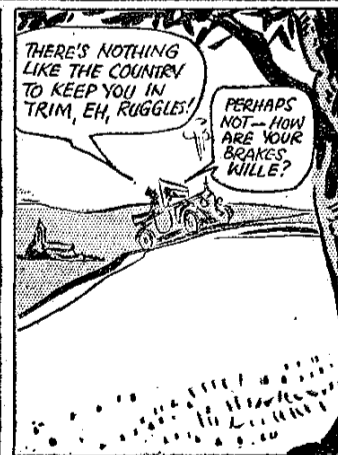
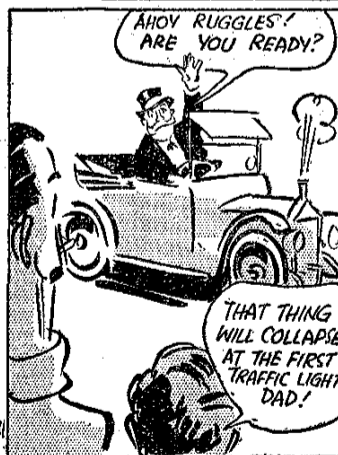
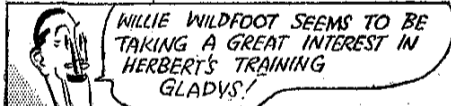
