BEST news yesterday concerning Goodwood was the weather report. If that "tip" comes off, it will be a glorious start to the Sussex fortnight. No meeting during the whole season is more dependent on fine weather for complete success than Good-

wood, although improved accommodation makes a misty, wet day less miserable than it could be only a few years ago.

Never noteworthy for big fields, some of the races this week will attract fewer runners than usual, but the handicaps, and particularly the Stewards' Cup, will lead to competition that might almost be described as fierce.

More than thirty runners will go out for the Stewards' Cup to-day. They come from Newmarket, the north and the south, with varying degrees of hope and confidence behind them which will be weakened or strengthened when the draw is known.

#### Helped by the Draw

Those on the spot will have the best chance of finding the winner because horses drawn on the far side—among the high numbers—are at a distinct advantage with those on the stand side

For that reason I hope that a high number will go alongside J. Crouch's name. If it does King's Gap should justify Newmarket's confidence that the Hon. G. Lambton has another hig race winner.

King's Gap was successful at Goodwood last year, and at the end of his three-year-old days was good enough to give Fairplay 12lb. and a neck beating over seven furlongs.

Also behind him on that occasion were Over Coat and Couvert, neither of which should turn the tables if, as is thought, he has recaptured his best form.

Next to King's Gap, the one I like best is Ipsden, whose trainer, Captain O. Bell, has a very fine record in this particular race.

The fact that Ipsden was left in in preference to Constellate is a tip in itself. At Lambourn they are confident that he will not be far away whatever wins.

NEWMARKET, Monday.

If a dozen horses for the Stewards Cup left here this morning, but Veuve Clicquot was not among them.

Even in her absence, however, the prize may still come here since King's Gap is at his best. He won his trial very easily a week ago, and although the opposition did not amount to much, it was a most convincing performance.

Grandjo is another that has done well with this race in view. He is set an altogether different task to that he attempted here a fornight ago and should at least turn the tables on Carissa.

Of our other runners I prefer Irenicon, who might easily be the one to win if a surprise is in store.

Three G's to Note

Several of the two-year-old races during the week will attract only small fields, and in more than one case the Aga Khan's representative will be the reason.

Mirza II will scare most of the opposition from the Lavant Stakes to-morrow; to-day Tahir will have only three opponents in the Ham Stakes.

Seventh Wonder, a good third at Ascot to Ramtapa, looks the best of them, but I can see no more than second prize to reward his long journey from Yorkshire.

Mahmoud's brother, Khan Bahadur, makes his first appearance in the Richmond Stakes. Big things are expected of this youngster in due course, but there is always a danger of inexperience being a big handicap on this course. Unbreakable, with two recent victories to his credit, has to concede 14lb, to Khan Bahadur and Greenroom, and so well did the latter shape at Sandown that it will not surprise me to see him beat them all.

Greenroom is owned by Mrs. Arthur James, whose lilac jacket is often lucky at Goodwood.
