

DAN BULGER IS STILL DRAWING THE BIG MONEY

DAN Bulger is still drawing the big money that is going on the Cambridge-shire. Although some people think he will find the ground too firm to-morrow and others opine that the handicapper has set him too big a task, he was a firmer favourite than ever at yesterday's call-over.

In all he was backed to win £15,000 and at the Victoria Club alone he has been supported at the various call-overs to win the best part of £50,000.

Much bigger sums are, of course, involved in the more important transactions that get no such publicity. Dan was heavily backed long before they got to work at the club.

But, as I have said, there are still plenty of anti-Dans, among them Johnny Dines, whose belief is unshakable that he has one to beat him in Artist's Prince.

Speaking louder than words, money put Artist's Prince on the same mark as Daytona yesterday, though on the "book" his chance is no better than that possessed by Red Squaw.

Maranta Back

Thankerton is still a 25 to 1 chance, but I think none the less of his prospects on that account. Indeed, it is this one and Daytona that I regard as the pair Dan Bulger will have most to fear from to-morrow.

Maranta, knocked out to 20 to 1 a week ago, is back as a 12 to 1 favourite for the Cesarewitch. He runs in the Lowther Stakes on Thursday, when the much-discussed "Manton problem" should be settled.

Haulfryn will be the only Cesarewitch horse of any consequence in the Jockey Club Cup field in Maranta's absence to-day, but, much as he has improved, I doubt that he will beat Columicille.

Lord Londonderry's horse always does his best on firm going, and I think he would have finished in front of Haulfryn at Goodwood if Wragg had secured a clear run.

On that occasion Columicille was conceding 8lb. To-day they meet at level weights.

Golden Sovereign To-day

Mahmoud's brother, Khan Bahadur, is among the entries for the Clearwell Stakes, but it is probable that he will give way to Par West.

In any case, I do not think he would beat Golden Sovereign, who ran really well behind Portmarnock and Mirza II and was twice a winner before taking on those top-notchers.

Linn of Dee, a clever winner at the last meeting, will again be ridden by Blackshaw in the Ditch Mile Nursery, but his rise in the handicap and Pappageno II may bar the way to another success.

Senior, an improving three-year-old, has a nice chance in the Autumn Handicap, though Over Coat is an obvious danger.

Not good arithmetic, but three and two halves made five for Gordon Richards at Chepstow. It came about in this way. Although a dead-heater gets only half the prize the jockey is credited with a win, and Gordon was in his second dead-heat when Shorts caught Rowan Tree on the post yesterday.

Richards had completed a hat-trick on Saturday with half a win on Miraculous, so that when Douane came up in the last race his score had advanced five points to 183 without any of the fireworks they expect from Gordon at Chepstow.

The differences in tote dividends was illustrated in the 18s. paid by the 100 to 8 chance, Coriolanus, and the 27 6s. 3d. received by backers of Wintenan, a 20 to 1 chance in the ring.

Victor Norman Bought to Change Luck

Top price of 1,650 guineas was paid by Mr. J. Ismay for the hurdle racer, Victor Norman, at yesterday's sale of horses owned by the late Mrs. Michael Stephens and of Mr. M. D. Blair.

Mr. Ismay, who has twenty horses in training, has not won a race this season, and he purchased Victor Norman in the hope that the newcomer would change his luck.

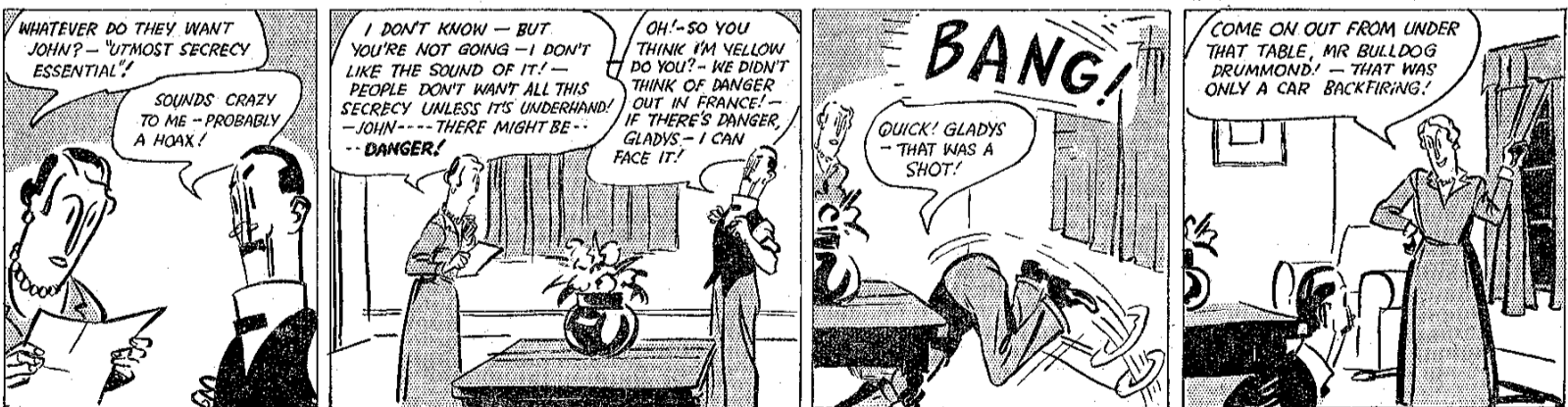
WIRES FROM THE STABLES
