

# DINES CONTINUES HIS BIG RACE HABIT AS TRAINER

**HAPPIEST** men in all England yesterday were Johnnie Dines and Midge Richardson, surely an excellent combination—in stature—to win so big a race as the Cambridgeshire.

For years we had known Dines as the little jockey for big races. Of late we have known him as a trainer confident that there was not a horse in the Cambridgeshire to beat Artist's Prince.

Midge Richardson had ridden eighty-four consecutive losers before he went out yesterday, so you can imagine his delight when No. 33 went up after one of the most desperate races we have seen across the flat for many years.

Little more than a length separated the first half dozen horses. Red Squaw, a neck behind Artist's Prince, beat Inchkeith a head for second place. Many of us thought Daytona was second. Actually he was not even fourth, as the judge gave that position to Zaimis.

Dan Bulger relieved bookmakers of all their anxieties quite early in the race. He looked to put his feet down a bit feelingly on the way to the post, and coming back he was fighting a losing battle from the bushes.

Going down the hill Weston made a despairing effort to put him into the fight again, but Inchkeith beat him off and that was the end.

### Thankerton's Good Race

Nadushka fared even worse. Nearly as well backed as Dan at the finish, she could never go the pace, and, always in the rear, only Kant II was behind her when she passed the post.

Thankerton ran really well under his big weight. So did Esquemeling from a bad place in the draw, but if one horse more than another deserved a better fate it was Daytona. Drawn No. 20 he had the stiffest part of the hill to climb at the finish as an additional handicap to his big weight.

As it was, he looked as much likely to win as anything as they went into the dip, but you might have picked any one of them as the likely winner at this point.

Allegiance, Laureat II, St. Magnus and Inchkeith were all there, and it was only in the last half-furlong that Artist's Prince got clear to hold off Red Squaw, on which little Power rode a very nice race.

First and second had finished level in a mile race at Doncaster when last they met, so form worked out right to the ounce where they were concerned.

Whether Inchkeith would have won if Nevett could have scraped another 2lb. off may be debated. His trainer thinks he would have done so, but, after all Artist's Prince also carried 2lb. overweight.

## ANOTHER TEST FOR MIRZA II

Quite a busy time at Newmarket to-day if we take in the Town Plate—now almost exclusively a women's race—which starts on the July Course at 11.30.

As an extra turn it should be good fun to the girl riders. The business will be as serious as the job Smirke takes on later in the day when Mirza II reappears in the Middle Park Stakes.

Instead of being held up, as was the case when he met with his first defeat at Doncaster, Mirza II will no doubt again be allowed to go all the way this time, and I don't think they will catch him.

### No Easy Task

At the same time I do not anticipate a spreading performance at the judge's end. Unbreakable won like a good colt over six furlongs at Goodwood, and even if he doesn't quite get up I am sure he will be making it warm for the Aga Khan's flyer in the last furlong.

Rantapa may not be saddled owing to the firm ground, and the same cause makes Maranta a "doubtful" in the Lowther Stakes, which is a pity because we all want to see a bit more of the Cesarewitch favourite.

If Maranta does turn out, his big pull in the weights should make him a winner. In his absence Flares may find an easy task.

Ipsden and Foray promise a rare thriller in the Challenge Stakes, with the prospects of Ipsden coming out on top. **BOUVERIE.**

## Marconi, Winner for Three Kings, Sold

Marconi, who won races for three monarchs, King George V, the Duke of Windsor when King Edward VIII, and King George VI, was sold at Newmarket yesterday for 330 guineas. Major Barrett, who trained him for all his races under National Hunt Rules, was the buyer.

The best prices were 510 guineas for each of Kingsbury and Cymbidium, sold respectively to the British Bloodstock Agency and Mr. A. McIntyre, and 500 guineas for Winastep. Mr. S. Mercer being the purchaser.

Artist's Prince was originally owned by Captain W. P. Ahern, who exchanged him for a yearling belonging to Dines. The horse was given to Mrs. Dines, who sold a half share in him to Major Glover.

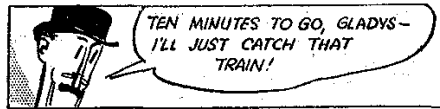
It was novice's luck for Major Glover, as he became an owner of racehorses only three months ago.

Le Ksar, who was unplaced, is to remain in England, and will be trained by W. R. Jarvis.

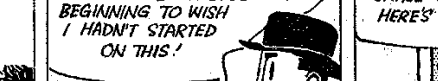
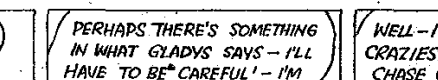
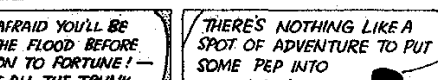
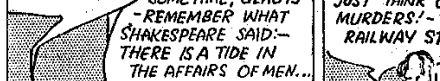
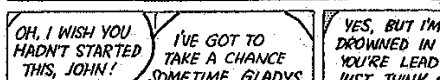
The stewards were called upon to decide whether A. Burns or P. Evans should ride Nadushka. They decided in favour of Evans.
