HAPPIEST men in all England yesterday were Johnnie Dines and Midge Richard-son, surely an excellent combination—in stature—to win so big a race as the Cambridge-shire.

RACE HABIT

AS TRAINER

For years we had known Dines as the little jockey for big races. Of late we have known him as a trainer confident that there was not a horse in the Cambridgeshire to beat Artist's

Midge Richardson had ridden eighty-four consecutive losers before he went out yesterday, so you can imagine his delight when No. 33 went up after one of the most desperate races we have seen across the flat for many

Dan Bulger relieved bookmakers of all their anxieties quite early in the race. He looked to put his feet down a bit feelingly on the way to the post, and coming back he was fighting a losing battle from the bushes.

Thankerton's Good Race

Nadushka fared even worse. Nearly as well backed as Dan at the finish, she could never go the pace, and, always in the rear, only Kant II was behind her when she passed the

Thankerton ran really well under his big weight. So did Esquemeling from a bad place in the draw, but if one horse more than another deserved a better fate it was Daytona. Drawn No. 20 he had the stiffest part of the hill to climb at the finish as an additional handicap to his big weight.

As it was, he looked as much likely to win as anything as they went into the dip, but you might have picked any one of them as the likely winner at this point.


