THERE was a hectic opening to the stock markets yesterday.

The marking down process which began in the "street" dealings the previous day continued. British Funds went sharply back as might be expected on the increase in income tax.

Other sections, including gold shares. suffered. Despondency lasted only about half an hour.

INFLUENTIAL SUPPORT

FOR OIL SHARES

It was soon found that investors were not anxious to sell. In fact, buying orders came in at the lower price levels.

From that moment prices rapidly made good earlier losses. Influential support came in for South African gold shares.

That market showed up remarkably well. Both the dividend paying and developing issues made pronounced headway. West Africans were once again in a confident mood.

ENGINEERING SHARES WORTH BUYING

I suggest that shares in various engineering ompanies are well worth investment attention. It is well known that firms manufacturing machine tools are enjoying particularly good business conditions.

I hear from responsible quarters that certain firms are unable to guarantee delivery of goods for the next two and a half to three years. They are chock full of orders.

INVESTORS LOOKING FOR HIGHER YIELDS

I regard Craven Brothers (Manchester) 5s. shares as a particularly attractive purchase at the present price of 11s, 3d.

Total dividend on the share capital of £300,000 was 15 per cent. last year. Earnings were over 28 per cent. At their present price they give a yield of £6 13s, per cent. This is a particularly attractive return.

Gordon's First Guineas Win—Now For the Derby

ORDON RICHARDS gained his first victory in the Two Thousand Guineas when Pasch justified all that had been said about him for the first classic. Now for the Derby will be the little champion's one thought until June 1. If an owner's luck can help, Gordon will certainly have some assistance.

Pasch is owned by Mr. H. E. Morriss, who some years ago asked Fred Darling to "buy him a horse to win the Derby." Darling bought him Manna.

A later purchase was the mare Soubriquet, for which Mr. Morriss gave 12,500 guineas. From her he has bred the unbeaten Tai-Yang and Pasca, who is the dam of Pasch. The winner will go to Epsom with the distinction of being the only unbeaten horse in the race.

To all intents and purposes, Pasch was a winner all the way. Richards told me afterwards that Scaraben and Cave Man both headed him for a furlong or so, but Gordon explained that he was taking a steadier when that happened.

Went Like a Good'un

Directly he gave him his head again he re-sumed the lead, and as Fred Herbert, who rode Scarabon put it, "He went on like a really

good 'un."

Next to Pasch there was not a better-looking horse in the field than Ramtapa, and at the top of Bushes Hill nothing looked more like taking a big hand in the fight than Sir A. Bailey's

Pound Foolish who, like Pasch, did not run as a two-year-old, was never far behind the placed horses, but it seems too much to expect him to make up more than half a dozen lengths on the winner in a month.

The King obviously enjoyed his day's racing, and the big crowd would laye enjoyed theirs even more than they did if hoxbrush had given them a chance of cheering a royal victory. The colt led for half-way in the Somersham Stakes, but then died right out.

Panorama, who has the reputation of being Captain Boyd-Rochfort's best two-year-old, runs for the first time to-day in the Newmarket Stakes. Big things are anticipated of this colt, but I doubt that he will start with a victory with Yakimour in the field
