CLIPSING everything in a wonderful first day at Ascot was the amazing luck of Mr. Peter Beatty, whose fame as the "man who bought big winners" will make a leading chapter in the story of 1938.

On the advice of Prince Aly Khan he purchased Bois Roussel a few weeks before the Derby. From the Aga Khan's son he bought Foxglove II at the week-end, and the colt won the Gold Vase almost as easily as Bois Roussel won the Derby.

Like the Derby winner, Foxglove II is engaged in the Grand Prix, but no decision has yet been made as to whether he will be sent to Paris with Bois Roussel at the end of the mouth.

Foxglove II had his race won a long way from home. So did Frawn, on which E. Smith rode a perfect race in the Ascot Stakes.

Mr. Grundy just missed a place behind Celibate II and Epigram, but he was never well enough placed to threaten real danger.

"Hotter" Than Mirza

### "Hotter" Than Mirza

Panorama—a hotter favourite than Mirza II last year—was still unbeaten after the Coventry Stakes, but he "wandered" more than once in the race, and, like the Aga Khan's colt, may shine only as a sprinter.

Sir Abe Bailey's colours were carried five times during the afternoon, but it was not his lucky day. Marante, like Mr. Grundy, finished fourth, Streak Away was third to Belle Travers and Yakimour, and both Helzephron and Golden Sovereign found one too good for them. Golden Sovereign found one too good for them. Golden Sovereign did get a bit nearer to Scottish Union than he had done at Epsom, but he never looked like upsetting the Derby second, who was the fourth favourite to win during the day.

The Hunt Cup and the meeting of Mirza II and Knight's Armour over five furlongs are outstanding features to-day, one the biggest lettery of the four days and the other a duel that promises thrills at both ends.

## Hunt Cup Prospects

I am sticking to Azam Pasha for the Hunt Cup, because he is about the best handicapped horse in the race; and there seems no doubt that he is considerably fancied.

Artist's Prince, Phakos, Galsonia, Laureat II and Lady of Shalott all come in the latter category—particularly the last-named, although fillies rarely win this race.

Pegasus has not been out this year. Newmarket advice suggests that he is every bit as good as when he finished within a neck and a head of the winner twelve months ago.

I am rather loath to leave out Terror, who might jump off and never be caught, but his best form has been shown on round courses, and he might not be so happy on this severe straight mile.

In addition to Azam Pasha and Knight's Armour—who may upset Mirza II—Mr. J. V. Rank's colours will also be carried by Black Speck, quite likely the best thing of the day, in the Bessborough Stakes
