minster's horses this season owing to the duke deciding to race only in France.

Lady Helen McCalmont bought today's winner, Red Biddy, from her husband yesterday, and the filly was saddled by Brisces today. Mr. Lambton confirmed however that Red Biddy will join his team at once.

Good Attendances

The course record for the year stands next year, these will be doubled if the racing is strengthened in a few of its weaker parts.
