BIG CHANCE IN THE JUBILEE

Medieval Knight Gives Another Shock

ACHTENAN WINS

By BOUVERIE

THE last of the spring handicaps will be decided at Kempton to-day, when, in spite of the many fancies for the Jubilee, Leighon should start favourite and win. Already this season Mrs. Singer's horse has won the Liverpool Cup, and shared the Rosebery Stakes over the Jubilee course. And because of the contitions of to-day's race he is better treated now than when he gained the first half of an anticipated double. * *

Carrying a 7lb. penalty for his Liverpool win, Leighon was giving Diamantee 12lb. in the Rosebery Stakes dead-heat. As the weights for the Jubilee had been published for some time, they shared the 10lb. penalty, and to-day we find Leighon giving 5lb. Scarlet Tiger is at an equal disadvantage since, conceding 6lb, he was four lengths behind the dead-heaters and now has to give Leighon 9lb.

Game Enough

Before his Liverpool victory I had my doubts about Leighon's liking for a stiff fight, but his game struggle with Diamantee at Kempton removed them finally. What he does not like is hard ground, and although it will not be soft to-day, there will be enough "give" to save him worrying about jarring himself. If the handicap could be remade, there is no doubt that Leighon would have several pounds more to carry and that cannot be said of any of his rivals.

The Blue Boy—who missed an apparently gilt-edged opportunity at Chester—has been a big tip for the race for some time, and the Hurst Park success of Alluvial has brought his stable companion, Snooker, well into the limelight. I should like the latter better with a stronger jockey, and Montrose might prefer a shorter distance. Solfatara, I am assured, is going to take a lot of beating, but the one that may prove the danger to Leighon is Disarmament, who might be the best each-way bet in the race.

Famous Names

Kempton has copied the Lingfield idea of naming races after great horses, and to-day Bendigo—winner of the first Jubilee—Minting, and the greatest of all Kempton favourites, Victor Wild, have their fame revived. Soldier Man won the Bendigo Plate last year, when it was known as the Sunningdale Handicap, and as he showed himself to be in form at Derby recently he is quite likely to do so again.

Spion Kop won the Victor Wild Plate then the Spelthorne Plate before his Derby victory, but there is nothing in to-day's field likely to bring off the same double. Washington, a stable companion to Windsor Lad, has a chance on his third to Tiberius at Newmarket, but I prefer Democrat because he proved his stamina behind Pip Emma at the Craven meeting and now has a nice pull in the weights with Lord Rosebery's filly.
