They were at Newmarket yesterday when I looked for a battle between Hypericn, Young Lover, Tai-Yang and company, but it dwindled down to a three-cornered fight oetween the Derby winner. Still, it is always good to see a great horse in action, and Weston showed us Hyperion at his best. On top of Bushes Hill Harinero led him by a length. Going into the dip Weston decided that it was time to get a move on, and in a few strides he had swept into the lead, and, although Wragg was after him on King Salmon, the margin was only three-quarters of a length by kind permission. Truly Hyperion is a great little horse.

Smart Juvenile

Newcomers are always among the most interesting of the runners at Newmarket. We were introduced to one with a big home reputation in Apollo in the Pampisford Stakes, and, judging by the good fight he made of it with the experienced Mythical Monk, he will improve on acquaintance. Sir Alfred Butt's horse had to be put under the whip to get the better of him, and I should be disappointed if the grey does not make a bit of a name for himself.


Another good thing justified a short price when Instantaneous gained her first victory in the Haverhill Stakes. Here again, however, there were some anxious moments as Foxcroft drew alongside the Manton filly, and for fully a furlong they raced head to head. All ended well when Instantaneous found a bit more up the hill, but it was a near thing. Mistress of Arts shaped like winning over a shorter course.

Canon Law Absent

Like Young Lover, Canon Law stayed away from the Newmarket Handicap owing to the firm ground, and with the conditions exactly as she likes them Effaceable strolled home an easy winner from Shrewton and the hard-ridden Rock Star. Free Fare ran a lifeless sort of race, suggesting that he wants his summer's rest. Abbots Worthy was never dangerous, and Highlander was done with as soon as an extra effort was required.

Orders Gray did not run up to the form he had shown at the last meeting in the Somerville Stakes, but Dispensation and Smoke Screen reproduced their previous running almost to the ounce. Dispensation won after an interesting tussle with The Jesuit to complete a double for Sir Alfred Butt, and she ran on with a determination one likes to see in a two-year-old. Both Saxham Cat colt and Berebos, who deputised for Ayertin, set themselves too much to do from the start.

T. Hawcroft and J. Lewis, who were first and second in the last race at Alexandra Park on Monday, were now concerned in the finish of the Apprentice Handicap, but this time Lewis came out on top. He was on Junior Counsel, and it was only by a head that he defeated Hawcroft on Millrock. The once smart mare, Hot Bun, was running on very strongly at the finish.
